

# Kids wrestlers finish season

The Norton Kids Wrestling Club completed a successful season with a picnic last Tuesday.

The 2004-'05 season began in early December with 58 wrestlers joining USA-KS Kids Wrestling, including 25 new wrestlers.

The season was completed on March 24-25 when 15 boys competed in the Kids Wrestling Championships in Topeka.

The Norton Kids Wrestlers competed in tournaments in Beloit, Hoxie, Ellis, Phillipsburg, Plainville, Oakley, Salina, Jetmore and Hays.

The Norton club held its own tournament on January 22 with more than 300 wrestlers competing.

Norton wrestlers placed well in every tournament.

In March, the Norton junior high and high school wrestlers were able to join the club in time to compete in the sub-district tournament in Goodland on March 12.

## Racing action held at speedway

Kelly Ford, Gene Sneath, David Murray Jr. and Wes and Chuck Eagleburger were feature winners in their divisions in racing action at Elmwood Park Speedway on Saturday.

Ford, of Phillipsburg, topped the caution-free IMCA stock car feature but had to work hard to earn it, thanks in part to Selden's Jason Rogers.

Ford took the lead on the opening lap of the 20-lap race followed by Tyler Hahn, Rogers, and Troy Attwood. Hahn and Attwood eventually retired from the race, and Rogers held the runner-up spot behind Ford at the halfway mark. The final 10 laps saw Rogers glued to Ford's back bumper.

Rogers tried to make the winning pass, but just could not muster enough power and had to settle for second. Jason Schoenberger, Josh Hudson and J.R. McCreery rounded out the top five. Heat race winners were Schoenberger and Rogers.

The IMCA hobby stock feature had its share of cautions with three lead changes in the 15-lap event.

Phil Hinger led the opening lap but gave way to Garrett Brown on lap 2. Following a caution on lap 3, Sneath, the veteran from Plainville, took the point on lap 4 and was able to hold off challenges by Kelly Karnopp and Jared

Remus to the checkers. Justin Wagner was fourth, followed by Brown. Heat race winners were Sneath and Brady Schoen.

David Murray of Oberlin won his third feature at Norton and career win 321. Murray started 10th in the 13-car field but took control on lap 3. He had a half-lap lead when the second and final caution waved with one lap to go, bunching the field for a one-lap shootout to the checkers.

But Murray powered away on the restart to take the win. Defending track champion Jeff Walters of Commerce City, Colo., finished second, followed by Brian Calhoon, Justin Basart and Tim Watts. Marty Clark and Murray were heat race victors.

Brothers Wes and Chuck Eagleburger of Norton were able to hold off the father/son duo of Joe and Jim Carter of Russell to claim honors in the caution plagued cruiser feature. Heat two winners Mike Hockemeier and Jim Ellis finished third. The Eagleburger brothers won the other heat race.

Racing action returns to the big half-mile oval on Saturday with the same four classes in action. Race time is 6 p.m.
