Elmwood Park Speedway races provide thrilling action

Jason Schoenberger of Russell came away with a win in the 20-lap IMCA Stock Car feature at Elmwood Park Speedway in Norton on Saturday that saw eight lead changes among four drivers.

Young Zach Schultz took the lead on the opening lap but gave way to Tyler Hahn on lap 2. Hahn was able to hold the top spot through lap 9 when ninth starting Josh Hudson took command after hanging on Hahn's back bumper

for several laps. Hahn and Hudson swapped the lead five times over the next several laps when Schoenberger finally made this move and took control late in the race.

Schoenberger was able to hold on to beat Hudson, Hahn, Jason Rogers and J.R. McCreery to the checkers in an exciting contest. Schultz and Schoenberger were victorious in their heat races.

The IMCA Hobby Stock feature saw four drivers in a battle for the win. Brady Schoen of Downs took

the lead on lap 2 from Phil Hinger and was able to hold off challenges by Jared Remus, Wade Wagenblast and Gene Sneath enroute to the checkers. Wagenblast got by Remus late in the 15-lap race to finish in the runner-up spot, while Sneath went up in smoke with a lap to go. Justin Wagner came on to finish fourth, trailed by Dustin McClurg. Heat race winners were Schoen and Wagenblast.

David Murray of Oberlin kept his winning streak intact at Elmwood Park with his fourth win in four races. Murray started scratch in the IMCA Modified feature and made his way to the lead on lap 5. He pulled away to win by half a lap in the 15-lap caution free race. Tim Watts finished second, followed by heat one winner Jeff Walters. Mitch Kline and Marty Clark completed the top five.

Tyson Garrison won the other heat race.

The Cruiser feature appeared to be more of a demo derby than a

race as only six cars finished the 10-lap race, with only four finishing on the lead lap. Mike Hockemeier and Jim Ellis took the early lead, but Jeremy Simmons and Ron Deal managed to avoid any mishaps and took the lead at the halfway mark. Simmons and Deal survived a couple more cautions to hang on for their first win of the season at Norton.

Hockemeier and Ellis finished second, followed by Jim Carter & Josh Hudson. Jeff Kleen and Mark Goebel and Wes and Chuck Eagleburger won the two heat races.

Racing action returns to the big half-mile oval on Saturday, May 7, with the same four classes in action, plus a special appearance by the 305 Sprint Cars. Race time will be 7 p.m.

Time for you to start making plans for buying, selling at farmer's markets

Farmer's market season is approaching. These markets are a great resource for fresh produce and other foods.

In Kansas, there are rules and regulations for the sale of foods in farmer's markets. Here are a few you should consider before starting a farmer's market or taking some of your products to one:

• Frozen meat is allowed only if processed in state or federal facilities and kept frozen.

• Fresh meat, meat products, poultry and fish are prohibited.

• Eggs must be kept refrigerated. Producers must register with the Kansas Department of Agriculture.

• Homemade jams and jellies are allowed. All other home-canned foods are prohibited.

• Foods not deemed potentially hazardous are allowed. These include baked goods like cookies, breads, fruit pies, cakes and cinnamon rolls. Other foods include fruits, vegetables, nuts and honey.

• Packaged foods must be properly labeled with the name of the
