William R. Wynne

Oct. 24, 1919 - April 27, 2005

William Robert Wynne, 85, Alma, formerly of the Almena area, died Wednesday at the Good Samaritan Hospital in Kearney, Neb.

Mr. Wynne was born Oct. 24, 1919, the son of William Henry and Retta Belle (Colby) Wynne at Almena.

He was baptized at the Evangelical Church at Almena in 1927 and attended Baker Rural School District. He graduated from Almena High School with the class of 1937. He attended Fort Hays State College from 1939 through 1941. He taught school at the Liberty Rural School in Phillips County for one year.

On Jan. 3, 1942, he entered the United States Army at Ft. Leavenworth. He served with the Headquarters Company, 11th Infantry Second Battalion and the 103rd Infantry Division in the European Theatre. Hereceived the European African Middle eastern Theatre Ribbon with two bronze stars, the Good Conduct Medal and the Overseas Service Medal. He was honorably discharged on Nov. 4, 1945, at Camp Campbell, Ky.

On Oct. 20, 1945, he and Carol Goings were married in Alma. They lived in Alma where he worked for the Carl Goings Company, later becoming half owner in that partnership. He retired after

40 years of service in 1991.

On Aug. 3, 1991, he married Hazel Mildred (Lindekugel) Wells in Holdrege. They continued to live in Alma.

Mr. Wynne was a permanent member of the Fay Cady American Legion and the Elks Club in Holdrege. He attended the Alma Evangelical Free Church.

He was preceded in death by his parents; a brother, Earl Wynne; two sisters, Marie Roeder and Ruth Griffin; a sister-in-law, Hulda Wynne; three brothers-in-law, Alfred Roeder, LeRoy Griffin and Roy Borges.

Survivors include his wife Hazel, of their home in Alma; one daughter, Jennifer and Roger Luther, rural Orleans, Neb.; one step-son, James and Carol Wells; one sister, Wilma Borges, Ft. Collins, Colo.; three grandchildren; and two step-grandsons.

A graveside memorial service will be at 2 p.m., Saturday at the Alma Cemetery. Pastor Larry Shaw will officiate.

Military honors at graveside will be conducted by the Alma American Legion and the Ft. Riley Veterans Military Guard.
