The new playground equipment at Elmwood Park is well on its way to being finished.

City Administrator Rob Lawson said the equipment is about threefourths assembled and if the weather holds out, should be all put together by the end of the

It will be a couple of weeks before children can play on it though, he said. After it's put together, mulch needs to be laid and a retaining wall built.

Mr. Lawson said the new playground equipment, which includes a large piece and a smaller piece, cost \$69,000.

The Lions Club put \$7,995 towards the smaller piece and also helped to put it together.

# Wheat crops may suffer from freezing temperatures

As I write this Friday afternoon, freezing temperatures into the low 20s are predicted for the area.

If we get temperatures that low, wheat likely will suffer. Injury to jointing wheat can be expected when air temperature dips to 24 degrees for a couple of hours.

As wheat continues to grow and move into the boot stage, it loses cold tolerance. Freeze injury can then be observed in the boot stage when temperatures reach 28 degrees for a couple of hours. Most wheat across the area is somewhere between jointing and boot, so injury will vary.

Another damage factor relates to the stand of the crop. If the crop has a thick canopy, it will be able to hold in heat radiating from the it will carry the heat away.

Other injury may be more severe, and the growing point died. The growing point is green in a healthy wheat plant. Freeze damage will cause it to turn brown. Farmers can check for this by
