Berton James Brown, Jr., 71, formerly of Prairie View, died April 9 at the Southern Arizona Veterans Administration Hospital in Tucson, Ariz.

He was born Oct. 19, 1933, in Prairie View, the son of Burton James and Marguerite Ileta (Goeken) Brown. He was a 1952 graduate of Prairie View High School.

Shortly after graduating, he entered the U.S. Army, serving in the Korean Conflict. Following his discharge he entered into the U.S. Air Force. 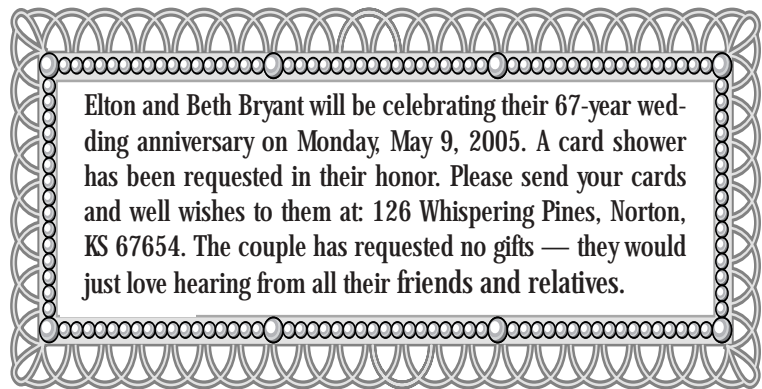
