This season, Philpot became the first quarterback in National Collegiate history in all divisions with three 1,000 yard rushingpassing seasons and the first to eclipse 3,500 yards rushing and 5.000 yards passing in a career.

With Philpot as a starter, Pitt State compiled a 38-8 record, the second highest win total in National Collegiate-II history.

Philpot has been a member of the Mid-America Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll for three straight years.

He has been active in Pitt State's Big Event function — a community-wide yard cleanup program. He has had public speaking opportunities at area elementary and junior high schools. He has also been a volunteer coach for the Pitt State YMCA Youth Football Clinic.
