

Seven Logan girls, one boy win medals at state

The Logan High School girls and a Trojan boy did well in Class 1A in the State Track Meet Friday and Saturday in Cessna Stadium at Wichita State University.

All eight Logan athletes earned medals as the girls finished in 18th place.

"We had a really good meet with everyone medaling," said Logan Coach Linda Nighswonger. "I was pretty pleased."

"Senior Lanee Webb earned three medals. She had a good season and good career," said Coach Nighswonger.

After placing second in the 800-meter run in the regional meet in 2 minutes 29.8 seconds, Webb finished fourth at state in 2:25.26, over four seconds better. It was a tight finish; she crossed the finish line just 1.3 seconds out of second place.

"The 800-meter time was a personal record for her," said Coach Nighswonger.

The Lady Trojans took 23 seconds off their regional time in placing fourth in the 4x800-meter relay.

They were timed in 10:43.4 in placing fourth in the regional and ran the race in 10:20.46 on Saturday.

Team members were sophomore Bethany Clements, freshman Jenny Archer, freshman Shelley Kemper and Webb.

"Our 4x800-meter relay team recorded their best time of the season," said Coach Nighswonger.

"We will miss Lanee but the fact that our other three team members are underclassmen bodes well for the future."

Clements placed fifth in the 1,600-meter run in 5:38.24, which was over 10 seconds faster than her 5:48.6, which earned second place at regionals.

"Bethany really ran well and set a personal record in the 1,600 meters," said Coach Nighswonger.

The Lady Trojan 4x100-meter relay team placed second in their heat on Friday in 53.21 and seventh in the finals on Saturday running 53.46

They were third in the regional meet with a 53.

Team members were junior Lisa Kaiser, junior Darci Goddard,

Hartman was fourth in the regional meet in the 200-meter dash in 27.4. In the state meet preliminary heat, she was 28.01 to place eighth and missed Saturday's finals.

Logan's 4x400-meter relay team, who placed third in the regional meet in 4:22.9, also failed to qualify for the finals at state when a baton was dropped during an exchange. The foursome finished the race but their time of 4:25.85 placed them sixth in their heat.

Team members were Clements, Kemper, Hartman and Webb.

"One of our girls was bumped unintentionally by a girl on another team just before one of the baton exchanges and it jarred the baton out of her hand," said Coach Nighswonger.

"She picked it up and we finished in as good a time as we had previous to the regional meet.

"It was a good learning experience."

As with the other two relays, all members of the 4x400 meter foursome, other than Webb, will return.

BOYS

Senior Zack Sammons threw the discus 152-4 to place second and earn the silver medal. He won the gold medal in the regional the week before with a throw of 147-10.

"Zack set a personal record by four feet in the discus," said Coach Nighswonger.

"He had to wait quite awhile to compete but really did well."



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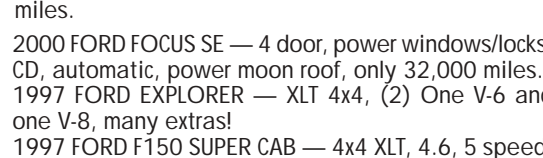
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
