Samuel H. Freeland, 85, former superintendent of Norton State Hospital, died Tuesday at Decatur County Hospital, Oberlin.

Mr. Freeland was born July 26, 1919, at Kingman, the son of Henry William and Beth (Bacon) Baldwin Freeland.

He lived in the Rozel area from 1950 until moving to Larned in 1959. In 1965 he moved to Norton. After retiring in 1982, he moved back to Larned.

He was a member of the First United Methodist Church and Stephens Ministry. He was a Bible study leader at Larned Health Care and a member and president of the Norton Rotary Club. During World War II, he was in the Army Air Force stationed in England.
