The compeer program is about making friends and changing lives.

Mrs. R. Mierhoff is from the Long Island area and talked about her personal life and how it affected her and her family.

She told club members about her father's attempted suicide in 1974. She said he was diagnosed as a manic-depressive (now called bi-polar disease) and would spend the next 23 years having more and more severe episodes.

She said, in those days people didn't talk about mental illness. It was swept under the carpet. However, she said mental illness knows no age, race or gender.

Mrs. Mierhoff asked members if they would consider becoming a compeer volunteer. Volunteers would receive training and be matched with someone locally, of the same gender, who just needs a friend. The relationship could be as simple as meeting for a cup of coffee once a week.

## Quintin Leroy Boddy

Sept. 11, 1928 - May 28, 2004

Quintin Leroy Boddy, son of the late Aura R. Boddy and Gertrude Nell (Witter) Boddy, former residents of Norton County, died May 28, 2004.

His family moved to Littleton, Colo., in 1940-'41, operating business interests before retiring.

Quintin attended Mt. Carmel Rural School until eighth grade before moving with his family to Littleton.

He graduated from Littleton High School and began working for the Arapahoe County Rural Electric Association. A short time later, he came back to Norton County to give farming a try.

He discovered Colorado was more to his liking and settled there for the rest of his career days, having his own company, subcontracting building electrical lines for the REA throughout the mountains.

Aug. 19, 1950, Quintin married Marjorie Campbell, in Littleton. They lived in the Woodland Park, Colo., area until her death April 24, 1985.

Quintin and their four children, Aura Quintin, Raymond Leroy, Kimberly Ann and Gregory Allan, continued to live in Woodland Park until they were grown and married.

On Sept. 2, 1988, Quintin married Billye Ruth Reavis. They retired, settling in Golden, Colo. They were affiliated with the Jehovah's Witnesses.

Virginia W. Mapes of Fort Collins, Colo., and Phyllis R. Harting, Norton, are older sisters of Quintin.

He was sadly missed May 29, 2004, when the Boddy Family Reunion was held in Norton County.
