The compeer program is about making friends and changing lives.

M r s . Mierfhoff is

from the Long Island area and talked about her personal life and how it affected her and her family. She told club members about

her father's attempted suicide in 1974. She said he was diagnosed as a manic-depressive (now called bi-polar disease) and would spend the next 23 years having more and more severe episodes. She said, in those days people

didn't talk about mental illness. It was swept under the carpet. However, she said mental illness knows no age, race or gender. Mrs. Mierfhoff asked members

if they would consider becoming a compeer volunteer. Volunteers would receive training and be matched with someone locally, of the same gender, who just needs a friend. The relationship could be as simple as meeting for a cup of coffee once a week. To learn more about the pro-
