In the 5-mile run, Kyle Merklein, Prairie View, had the fastest overall time of 31 minutes, 39 seconds and won the 15-19 division.


Syndee Cole, Phillipsburg, won the women's 15-19 division, with a record time of 37:04 and also had the fastest overall women's time.


