Kansas law provides that whenever a child enrolls in a public school for the first time, the school is required to secure proof of identity of the child. Proof of identity is either a birth certificate for a child enrolling in kindergarten or first grade, a copy of the court order placing the child in the custody of the Social and Rehabilitation Services or a certified transcript or other similar public record of a child enrolling in Grades 2 through 12. If proof is not provided to the school within 30 days of enrollment, the school must notify the law enforcement agency which must promptly investigate the identity of the child.

#### STUDENT HEALTH ASSESSMENTS:

As required by current law, all students, ages 8 and under, shall submit evidence that they have undergone an appropriate health assessment prior to entering kindergarten or before enrolling in the district for the first time if they were not previously enrolled in a school in Kansas.
