Shirley Maxine Taylor, 92, formerly of Lenora, died July 29, in Walnut Creek, Calif.

Mrs. Taylor was born June 24, 1913, to Remus and Daisy Jacobs in Lenora. She was the granddaughter of Enos and Sarah Patterson of Lenora.

She attended Lenora schools, where she was active in music, sports and theater and a member of the championship Lenora girls basketball team. She graduated from Lenora High School in 1931.

She majored in education at Kansas State University, graduating in 1935.

While at K-State, she met another music major, Howard Taylor, Norton, and they married in Lenora on June 17, 1937.

The couple just celebrated their 68th wedding anniversary.

She was in elementary and secondary education for 40 years, teaching in Kansas, Colorado and California. She returned to college and earned her library credential. She also gave piano instructions.

While in Lenora, she was a member of the First Congregational Church and a Lone Girl Scout. She was a Girl Scout leader, 4-H project leader and Sunday School teacher.

In California, she was a founding member of the Clayton Branch of the American Association of University Women, a member of the Clayton Historical Society, the Clayton Pavilion Seniors and the Clayton Women's Club. She was also a member of the Diablo Vista Retired Teachers Association. She was a volunteer at the Clayton Library and the Concord Pavilion and was a 60-year member of the Eastern Star.

Survivors include her husband, Howard, Concord, Calif.; a son, Richard, Concord; two daughters, Anita, Concord and Beverly Jean, Anchorage, Alaska; three grandchildren; and five great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m., Monday at the United Parish Church in Lenora. The Rev. Jack Kersenbrock will officiate. Burial will be in the Lenora South Cemetery.
