

Norton prepares to start classes

Enrollment for the Norton School District is just around the corner.

At the high school, seniors will register from 9 a.m. to noon Monday, Aug. 8; juniors, 9 a.m.-noon Tuesday, Aug. 9; sophomores, 9 a.m.-noon Wednesday, Aug. 10; and freshmen, 9 a.m.-noon Thursday, Aug. 11.

New high school students and those who cannot make the other times can register from 9 a.m. to noon on Friday, Aug. 12.

Junior high registration will be 9 a.m.-noon Wednesday, Aug. 10, for eighth graders and Thursday, Aug. 11, for seventh graders.

Eisenhower Elementary enrollment for early childhood through sixth grade will be from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 9, in the Eisenhower cafeteria.

The first day of school will be Friday, Aug. 19. Classes will meet from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. and the buses will run.

Superintendent Greg Mann said there will be a few new faces this year. Eisenhower Elementary has a new principal, Corey Roy, and a new Title I math instructor, Wendy Haresnape.

At the high school Erin Hill will be teaching English and Melinda Fleckenstein, biology. Dennis Burge is the new junior/senior high woods instructor.

There will be one librarian and three aides. Jane Burton is taking over both school libraries. Mr. Mann said there will always be two people in each of the libraries.

School supplies needed by students are:

- Resource room — wide-lined notebook paper, crayons, pencils, a glue stick and an eraser.

- Early childhood — two large glue sticks, a set of Crayola water-colors, a box of eight Crayola crayons, a box of classic color wide tip Crayola markers, a small pencil box, a box of tissues and a large book bag.

- Kindergarten — three No. 2 lead pencils, a box of eight and a box of 16 Crayola crayons, a 4-ounce bottle of Elmers school glue, a pair of five-inch sharp tip Fiskars scissors, two large glue sticks, a pencil box, a pink eraser, a large book bag, a box of tissue and a small pillow for resting.

- First grade — No. 2 lead pencils, a small pencil box, a box of 24 Crayola crayons, three boxes of 8 Crayola crayons, a pair of five-inch sharp tip Fiskars scissors, a four-ounce bottle of white Elmers glue, four large glue sticks, a box of zip-top baggies, two pocket folders without fasteners and a large book

bag.

- Second grade — Binney and Smith Crayola Crayons: a box of 24 standard colors and two boxes of eight standard colors, No. 2 lead pencils, two large rubber erasers, a box of 200-count tissue, a wooden ruler with a metal edge and inch and centimeter markings, Elmers school glue, four large glue sticks, three wide-lined perforated spiral notebooks, a pair of Fiskars scissors, a small school box and a pocket folder without fasteners.

- Third grade — No. 2 lead pencils, a plastic pencil bag, crayons, colored pencils, a rubber eraser, Elmer's white school glue, one glue stick, blue ink pens, a wooden ruler with a metal edge with 1/4-, 1/2- and 1-inch and centimeter marks, a pair of Fiskars scissors, a box of 200-count tissues, wide-lined notebook paper with no trappers, two wide-lined spiral notebooks and two folders for paper.

- Fourth grade — No. 2 lead pencils, markers, a highlighter, crayons, colored pencils, a rubber eraser, two glue sticks, Elmers white school glue, scissors, a clear plastic pencil bag, a ruler with inch and centimeter marks, three folders for paper, three spiral notebooks, wide-lined notebook paper with no trappers and two boxes of tissue.

- Fifth and sixth grades — No. 2 lead pencils, colored pencils, highlighters, an eraser, blue or black erasable ball-point pens, scissors, Elmer's glue, a wooden ruler with a metal edge and 1/16-inch and centimeter marks, a drawing compass, a protractor, tissue, wide-lined loose leaf notebook paper and six plastic portfolio folders with two pockets and three fasteners.

- Junior high — a spiral notebook for each subject and three for English or dividers in their notebook for each subject and two separate spiral notebooks for English, student planners, No. 2 lead pencils, blue or black ink pens, colored pencils, a protractor, a bow compass, a calculator with percentage and square root keys, a book bag, and physical education clothing including T-shirt, shorts and tennis shoes.

Lenora students can still get enrolled

The Lenora Grade School has already held its enrollment, but it's still not too late.

Superintendent Ken Tidball said although the official enrollment day was Wednesday, parents can still enroll their children until school starts. They just need to go to the grade school office.

Lenora students' first day will be Wednesday, Aug. 17. The school will be open at 7:45 a.m. with breakfast served from 7:50 to 8:15 a.m.

Supplies needed for the students are:

- Kindergarten — crayons, No. 2 pencils with erasers, erasers, washable wide line markers, two boxes Kleenex, small scissors, two pocket folders, four glue sticks, a bottle of glue, a 12-inch ruler with both inch and metric edges, a small plastic supply/pencil box, a paint shirt or apron, a water bottle, a large towel or mat for rest time and physical education shoes.

- First and second grade — two boxes of crayons (24 regular size), one large box Kleenex, two eight-ounce bottles of Elmers glue, four large glue sticks, two large erasers, scissors, No. 2 pencils with erasers, two boxes of eight Crayola broad line magic markers, two school boxes, a school bag, a wa-

ter color paint set with eight colors, folders with pockets, a paint shirt, a water bottle, three spiral notebooks and physical education shoes.

- Third and fourth grade — No. 2 pencils with erasers, two packages of wide-lined notebook paper, three 70-sheet wide-lined spiral notebooks, erasers, a 12-inch ruler with inch and metric edges, two boxes Kleenex or Puffs tissues, crayons, markers, a water color paint set with eight colors, colored pencils, scissors, a bottle of school glue, a glue stick, four pocket folders, erasable ink pens, a paint shirt, a water bottle, physical education shoes.

- Fifth and sixth grade — No. 2 pencils with erasers, black or blue ink pens, broad markers, two glue sticks, a 12-inch ruler with inch

and metric edges, a protractor, a

compass, scissors, three 70-sheet wide-lined notebooks, two pocket folders, a strong three-ring binder with at least two inches of loose leaf wide-lined notebook paper, a package of notebook dividers with label tabs, erasers, two boxes Kleenex, a water bottle, and physi-

cal education shoes.

Mr. Tidball said there have been no changes in staff this year and no new teachers.

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Northern Valley ready for school

The Northern Valley School District's student enrollment is getting close.

Students who have last names beginning with the letters "A" through "J" will enroll at their schools on Monday, Aug. 8, while students with last names beginning with "K"-"Z" should enroll on Tuesday, Aug. 9.

Elementary students can enroll at either grade school building.

The first day of class for the Huskies will be Thursday, Aug. 18. Classes will be held from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. Breakfast will be served between 7:45 and 8:20 a.m. But if a child is not eating breakfast, he or she should stay home until 8:05 a.m.

School supplies needed are:

- Preschool — a box of Kleenex, a watercolor paint set, a dry erase marker, six glue sticks and two No. 2 pencils.

- Kindergarten — a box of eight crayons, a box of eight markers, an eraser, two pencils, a glue stick, a glue bottle, scissors, a small supplies box, physical education shoes, a small pillow, a one-inch three-ring binder, a paint shirt, a box of snack or graham crackers and a box of Kleenex.

- First grade — three No. 2 lead pencils, a box of 16-24 crayons, a one-inch plastic three-ring binder, a box of the basic eight crayons, a white or pink jumbo eraser, white Elmers school glue, glue sticks, a paint shirt, a set of markers or felt tip pens (optional), physical education shoes, a video tape, an audio cassette tape, two large boxes Kleenex, one supplies box and

scissors.

- Second grade — three No. 2 lead pencils, a box of 24 crayon colors, a pink jumbo eraser, white Elmers school glue, glue sticks, two large boxes Kleenex, a supply/pencil box or bag, a set of felt tip pens, physical education shoes, a paint shirt and a wide lined notebook.

- Third grade — two No. 2 lead pencils at all times, a box of 16-24 crayons, a set of colored pencils, an eraser, white Elmers glue and a glue stick, two wide-lined notebooks, two sets of markers (thin and wide-line), a set of water colors, two large boxes Puffs tissues, physical education shoes and scissors.

- Fourth grade — six No. 2 lead pencils, a box of 16-24 crayons, an eraser, Elmers glue or a glue stick, a wide-lined notebook (tablet or white), a 12-inch ruler with metal edge and inch and metric marks, two large boxes Kleenex, a set of colored pencils, a set of felt tip pens (optional), two large boxes Kleenex, scissors, a set of colored pencils, dry erase markers and physical education shoes.

- Fifth grade — six No. 2 lead pencils, a box of crayons (any size), an eraser, Elmers glue, scissors, a one-subject spiral notebook, notebook paper, a 12-inch ruler with metal edge and inch and metric marks, two large boxes Kleenex, a set of colored pencils, a set of felt tip pens or markers, physical education shoes, a highlighter and a glue stick.

- Sixth grade — six No. 2 lead pencils, an eraser, Elmers glue, scissors, three one-subject wide-lined spiral notebook, a 1-inch

plastic 3-ring notebook binder, a 12-inch ruler with a metal edge and inch and metric marks, two folders, a set of felt tip markers, two large boxes Kleenex, two packages of wide-lined notebook paper, physical education shoes, a box of crayons (any size), a highlighter and a supply box or book.

- Seventh and eighth grade — six No. 2 lead pencils, an eraser, a set of felt tip pens, colored pencils, black or blue ball-point pens, spiral notebooks for the four subjects, two large boxes Kleenex, physical education clothes and shoes and a non-formatted computer disk.

- High school — Pencils, an eraser, ball-point pens, notebooks, Kleenex, instructors may require additional items. History classes require an 80-page notebook and a set of colored pencils.
