

New business specializes in skin care

Healthy skin, a relaxed atmosphere and pleasing results are the mission of Joslyn Henson, Norton's newest business owner. Mrs. Henson, a native of Norton and a 1991 graduate of Norton Community High School opened her store "e11even skin essentials" Aug. 3 in a newly remodeled office at the west end of the Wesco Feed building, on County Road 1E just off U.S. 36 on the east edge of Norton.

E11even is dedicated to treating the skin and Mrs. Henson, a licensed esthetician, took her training in Kansas City, Kan., graduating in June.

"I have always been interested in skin care," she said. "I have an aunt in Denver who owns a spa, so I've been around it for years. I am passionate about this and I want to share it with others."

Nancy Kent, Norton, owner of "A Place For Everything" designed and installed the countertops and cabinetry in the treatment room.

Mrs. Kent, herself a client, spoke very highly of the treatments.

"For me, it's not just about pampering myself," she said. "It's about keeping my skin healthy and slowing the aging process."

Mrs. Kent has had a skin analy-

sis, which every client receives, a deep-pore cleansing treatment and facial and body waxing.

Mrs. Henson said that she gives each client a free consultation. She wants to know about their concerns for their skin.

Next, she examines their face, using the skin scanner. This illuminates imperfections, age spots, acne and skin condition.

Then she discusses treatment. After treatment, she recommends a home skin-care program.

She said good results depends both on the treatment itself and on the willingness of the client to follow the home skin care program.

She said treatments can help sun-damaged skin and can help lighten dark spots.

She also offers hope in the treatment of acne, both teenage and adult.

"Acne is one of the most difficult conditions to treat," she said.

She recommends starting with the deep-pore cleansing, followed by multiple skin peels and a good home-care program.

She said she treated a client in Kansas City with severe acne.

She saw him once a week, administered peels and devised a home-care plan.

She said he had a 95 percent improvement. This client graduated from high school this spring

and wrote her a thank you letter for all the help she gave him.

"Your skin is the largest organ of our body and, it's probably the most neglected," she said. "It's our first line of defense and the first thing people see."

Other services offered at "e11even" include a foot treatment chair. A client will receive a soothing foot soak, exfoliation, a scrub, foot massage, masque and finally a heel recovery cream. She also applies an anti-aging treatment for arms, hands and feet.

Waxing of body and facial hair

is offered.

The good news, she said, is that because the hair comes back finer, the discomfort diminishes each time the procedure is done. The other good news is that you can be "hair-free" for three and a half to six and a half weeks.

A professional make-up application and lesson is another service.

Mrs. Henson sells G.M. Collin skin care products, a mineral make-up with a light, natural look.

She treats both men and women and carries a complete line of

men's skin care products.

Assisting her in the office is her mother, Linda Carter.

"We've been very pleased with the community's response," said Mrs. Carter. "We've been swamped."

Mrs. Henson and her husband, Chris, have two children, Alexis, 11, and Tyus, 7.

Post office to provide new forwarding service

The post office is trying something new—charging for forwards mail.

The new service will allow residential customers to receive mail in a bundle once a week. It is aimed at snowbirds, college students and others who will be gone for awhile, but aren't moving around.

The service will cost \$10 for an application and then \$10 per week.

As an example, if a person wanted mail to be sent to them every Friday for six weeks, it

would cost \$70.

Norton Postmaster JaNan O'Brien said people can still get their mail forwarded for free for as long as needed by putting in a temporary change of address, but with the new service, they will get their mail in a more timely manner and all in one bundle.

"It's a convenience for these people because they know they are just looking for one packet of mail once a week," she said.
