HANSEN MUSEUM

So what is showing at the Hansen Museum now?

Oh, nothing much. We just have a house inside our building.

Yep, it's a house. Sometime referred to as a shack or cabin, the African-Americans of the south could have called this home. Built to actually size, this installation by Whitfield Lovell arrived in sections of walls, flooring and roof.

The dingy interior mirrors the life of these southerners during the 1920s.

Furnished with minimal belongings, the cabin gives the viewer a true sense of the times and culture.

This exhibit, "Whispers from the Walls", also highlights lifelike charcoal of people, who might have lived in a dwelling such as this.

Mr. Lovell's drawings give you a greater sense of realism as you pass through the doors of the one-room shack and experience the sights, sounds and smells of this traveling creation.

Booked through Exhibits USA, "Whispers" will be in the gallery through Sept. 18. Take a trip back in time and visit the Hansen Museum.
