Using a libero is a coach's option. The coach may use a libero in the first game of a match and not the second, or vice versa. If a team does use a libero, that does not obligate the opposing team to use one as well.

"We will use it often since we have some great passers." Coach Lively said.

The use of a libero also adds a official. Each team that uses a libero must supply a person to serve as an assistant scorekeeper to track libero substitutions and ensure the rules on its use are lations to the umpire.
