

Doubles team wins crown

The Norton Community High School No.2 doubles team took the championship in the Phillipsburg Quadrangular Tennis Tournament Tuesday.

Reesa Volgare and Kayleigh Brooks won two matches and lost one for a three-way tie with Russell and Phillipsburg for first place, then won the tiebreaker to earn the title.

Volgare and Brooks defeated Phillipsburg's Whitney Cole and Kali Asher 8-2 in their first match. Next, they lost a close 6-8 contest to Audrey Krug and Kyla Reinhardt, Russell. In their final match, they outscored Trego's Marlowe Opat and Dana Diec 8-1.

Phillipsburg won the overall championship with 28 points, followed by Russell, 20; Trego, 8; Norton, 4.

Hannah Mills and Chelle Donovan played No. 1 doubles for

the Lady Jays and placed fourth. They lost their first match 2-8 to Kayla Jarvis and Allison Dusin, Phillipsburg, then lost 2-8 to Jessica Gudenkauf and JayCee Gfeller, Russell. Their final match was a 7-8(5-7) tiebreaker loss to Julia Albin and Samantha Augustine, Trego.

Jarvis and Allison placed first, followed by Gudenkauf and Gfeller in second and Albin and Augustine in third.

The Lady Jays' No.1 singles player was Jessica Cook. She lost her first match 1-8 to Melinda Schremmer, Phillipsburg, then lost 1-8 to Katie Coker, Russell. Her final match was versus Leanna Newcomer, Trego, and she lost 2-8.

Schremmer was the champion. Coker, second; Newcomer, third; and Cook, fourth.

In No.2 singles, Norton's Lisa Jones lost 1-8 to Phillipsburg's

Sara Fawver, lost 1-8 to Russell's Mallory Mahoney and lost 5-8 to Trego's Cassie Dietz.

Fawver placed first, followed by Mahoney, Dietz and Jones.

"Our best finish was at No.2 doubles," said Norton Coach Jim Green. "Reesa and Kayleigh tied for first and won the highest percentage of games and placed first."

"Hannah and Chelle continue to play well. They really had a close loss to Trego in a tiebreaker."

"Jessica is playing much better than the scores of her matches indicate."

"Lisa had a good match against Cassie Dietz of Trego."

The Norton Junior Varsity Quadrangular will be held Saturday in the Pool Park, beginning at 10 a.m.

On Tuesday the team will be in the Phillipsburg Varsity Quad starting at 3 p.m. and the junior varsity in a tournament in Goodland, starting at 2:30 p.m.

Eighth-graders take victory

The Norton Junior High eighth-grade Lady Jays defeated Plainville 25-4, 25-3 in the volleyball season opener Sept. 1.

"I've said for many years now that the key to winning in volleyball, especially junior high volleyball, is being able to serve the ball to your opponent and have it land on the court inbounds," said Coach Chuck Zimmerman. "The second skill you must have is to be able to control the serve that is sent to you."

"Well, against Plainville in our opening match of the season, that is what happened. We served extremely well; the young Cardinals had trouble even making clean contact with the ball on their platform (the receiving area on a player's extended arms). Our servers kept making them move, which is another key, and they were not able to get set in front of the ball to pass it into their offense."

"We started by allowing Plainville to make the first serve,

but we handled their offering, causing them to make a mistake in volleying, giving up our first point of the year. We controlled the rest of the game with our serves."

The Junior Lady Jays had streaks — Ashlie Stewart had five in a row, Alyssa Thomson, 10; and Kendra Engelbert, seven.

"In the second game where we served first... well, we flubbed one and the Cardinals received a point," he said. "But, from then on it was again our serving and our floor play. When they did return our serves, we had some very fine digs (defensive passes to keep the ball off the floor and alive), some fine setting and even a few very good hits."

In this game, Shelby Jones served four in a row; Thomson, seven; Bethany Winkel, eight; and Kayla Lee, three.

"While these girls were serving, the rest of the team had to stay on their defensive toes and keep Plainville's returns alive so that

we could control the ball to get our 'combos' going. Combos equal a pass, set and spike. We did and had a few combos that led to points. The final score was 25-3."

The junior varsity also came out on top, winning 25-17, 25-12.

"Our junior varsity, which is made up of both the eighth- and seventh-grade teams, followed in the varsity's footsteps and came away with a victory by out-serving the Cardinals and out playing them on the floor. We had some very fine passing skills displayed throughout the games."

Austine Dole was the top server in the first game with eight, which she and her teammates turned into points. In the second game, Kaitlyn Ross served over five in a row while Katie Gall put six over for the team to play and Melissa Byler chipped in with five.

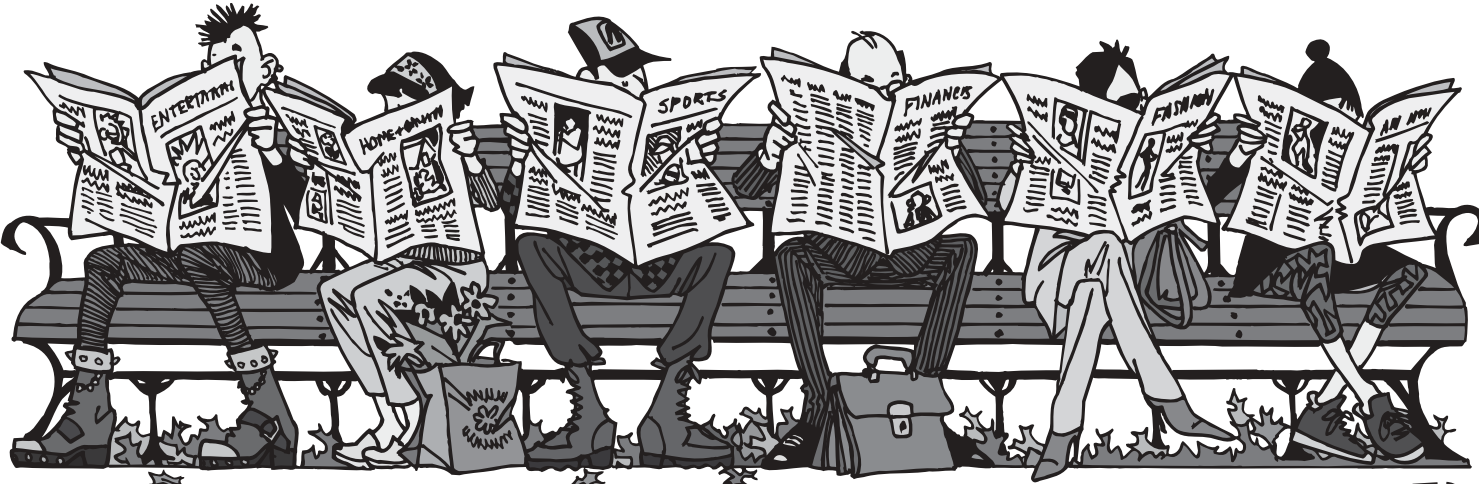
