Marilyn Dial will be running Grandma's Country BBQ, which will be serving smoked pork, chicken and brisket, Cajun and summer sausage, chips, candy bars and nachos and cheese.

Tad Felts will be the Master of Ceremonies for the 30th year.

Musical will include Mark Nebel, who will be doing his one-man band act from 10 to 11 a.m., 12:30 to 1:15 p.m. and 2:30 to 3:30 p.m. on the north stage; and Jim Pemberton, who will be singing his country blues from 11:15 a.m. to 12:15 p.m., 1:30 to 2:15 p.m. and 4 to 5 p.m. on the south stage.

The kids' tent will be from 1 to 4 p.m. with face painting and free balloons from 1 to 2 p.m.
