**ORDINANCE NO. 1551**  
**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE CODIFICATION OF THE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NORTON, KANSAS, AND THE PUBLICATION OF SUCH CODIFICATION IN LOOSE-LEAF BOOK FORM.**

BE IT ORDAINED By the Governing Body of the City of Norton, Kansas:

**Section 1.** That a codification of the general ordinances of the City of Norton, Kansas, including supplements thereto, as authorized by K.S.A. 12-3014 and 12-3015, is hereby ordered, authorized and provided for, the preparation of which shall be done by the Norton City Officials. When completed, the codification shall be adopted by ordinance and published together with the adopting ordinance in loose-leaf book form. No fewer than 10 copies

shall be published. Such codification shall be entitled, "Code of the City of Norton, Kansas," of the year in which the work is completed and ready for publication. The said code shall be duly certified by the City Clerk. One copy of the code shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk and shall constitute the official ordinance book. Three additional copies shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk and shall be designated for the use of the public.

**Section 2.** That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication once in the official city newspaper.
