## Boys take second, girls third in Trego cross country meet

The Norton Community High School boys placed second and girls, third, in the Trego Cross Country Invitational Meet Thursday in WaKeeney.

Thomas More Prep-Marian of Hays won the boys championship with 50 points, followed by Norton, 62; Hoisington, 95; Trego, 106; Ness City, 113; Lakin, 135; Quinter, 138; and Hill City, 149.

The girls championship went to Hill City with 55 points, followed by Thomas More, 57; Norton, 62; Lakin, 73; Quinter, 110; and Trego, 123.

Norton freshman Laura Lee Baird won her second championship in three starts as she ran away from the field to earn the gold in Hager. 12 minutes, 44 seconds.

Baird won the Norton Invitational in 13:58, then placed sixth in Wamego in 13:24.43.

In winning at Trego, Baird defeated Molly Schmeidler, Thomas More, who won last year's race in 13:29. Despite bettering her time to 13:18 this year, she was unable to catch the flying Baird and had to settle for second place.

"Laura Lee ran a super race," said Coach Deyton Hager. "She worked very hard this week. We had her running with the boys to improve her time and it paid off for her. Yet, we both know that she is not at the time she needs just yet."

Placing fifth for the Lady Jays was freshman KaraJo Jones in 13:48, her best time of the year. Jones placed fifth at Norton, as well, where ran 15:12 and 25th at Wamego in 14:31.28.

"KaraJo also ran very well," said Coach Hager. "Her time keeps improving and that is what she must do every week."
