Reva I. Smith

Reva Iris (Severns) Smith, 88, died Wednesday at the Norton County Hospital.

The daughter of Orin Edgar and Ida Margaret (Wetzler) Severns, she was born March 8, 1917, northeast of Norton.

She attended the District 10 Star School and two years of high school in Almena. She transferred to Norton Community High School where she graduated in 1936. Following graduation, she worked as a nurse's aide at the State Sanatorium for tuberculosis and later as a medical technician.

On June 5, 1937, Reva and Lawrence Andrew Smith were married at a friend's house in Densmore. They lived on the hospital grounds, where Lawrence was also employed in the power-house. After a few years, they moved to a farm south of Long Island, and in 1943, they moved to the farm just northwest of Almena. In 1980, they moved into Almena. They were married for 45 years before Mr. Smith died in 1983.

She was a member of the Almena Congregational Church and was instrumental in the development of the Prairie Dog Press newspaper. She was a former

member of the Harrison Township Extension Homemakers Unit, Heritage Quilt Club, Kansas Quilters Organization, and Sunflower Pioneer Power Association.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, five brothers, Ross, Rex, Bernell, Keith, and Verne and a sister, Zelia Hinez.

Survivors include: a son, Russel and Sue Smith, Kingman, Ariz.; a daughter, Beth Heikes, Norton; a brother, Dale and Katherine Severns, Norton; three sisters, Inez Taylor, Oxford, Neb., Nina Melroy, Norton, and Ila Zellmer, of the Andbe Home in Norton; five grandchildren; and eight great-grandchildren.
