Just 26 second later, Northern Valley responded with another touchdown on a nine-yard pass from Copper to Thalheim. The pass for points after failed.

With 9:53 showing, Copper dashed five for the Huskies last touchdown. Thalheim ran in the extra points, giving Northern Valley a 56-12 lead.

Western Plains made it in the end zone one final time with 2:59 left in the game when Casey rushed 18 yards to score. Casey ran in the points after, for a final tally of 56-20.


