Dave Beckwith April 4, 1936 - Oct. 1, 2005

Dave Beckwith, 69, Pueblo, Colo., a 1954 graduate of Norton Community High School, died Oct. Saturday.
Mr. Beckwith was born April 4, 1936, the son of Ray and Lillie Beckwith.
Following high school graduation and three years of college at Fort Hays State, he worked in Oberlin as a law enforcement officer with his uncle, Luther Capps.
He was married in 1965, and moved to Denver where he worked for the Denver Sheriff's

department for 28 years. He retired from the sheriff's department in 1993. In 1995, he and his wife, Fran, moved to Burlington, Colo. In 1999, they moved to Pueblo.
Survivors include his wife; two sons, John and Kathy Beckwith and Joe and Jeanette Beckwith; three daughters, Jill and Charles Wojan, Julie and Alan King and Jeri and Wendell Kennedy; and 18 grandchildren.
Funeral services were held today at Advantage Englewood Chapel, Englewood, Colo.
