Coach Deyton Hager's Blue Jay boys won the title on Thursday in Phillipsburg by scoring 45 points. Ellis placed second with 64, followed by WaKeeney, 73; Phillipsburg, 82; Hill City, 85.

Oberlin competed as a nonleague team and placed sixth.

Norton freshman Zach Bainter was the individual champion with a time of 18 minutes, 6.77 seconds for the three mile race.

Blue Jay junior Logan Keiswetter placed fourth in 19:03.79. He was also fourth in the overall race.

Norton junior Jared Engelbert placed 10th in 19:30. He was 12th in the overall race.

Placing 16th for Norton was junior Jared Bebb in 19:48.15. He was 18th overall.

Freshman Coady Nickell ran his second best time of the season to place 17th in 19:53.87. He was 19th overall.

Junior Kent Mann placed 19th in 20:28.04 and he was 21st overall.

Northern Valley's Clarke Nelson was first into the end zone 13 seconds into the game when he rushed 65 yards to score. Avery Thalheim ran for the conversion.

Logan scored with 7:50 showing when Bryant Reese passed 24 yards to Ethan Gottschalk.

At 7:11, Nelson ran another 64 yards for a second touchdown. Thalheim ran in the points after.

The Huskies scored again with 4:08 on the clock on a 15-yard run from Thalheim.

Levi Kiser put 6 more on the board for the Trojans 16 seconds later on a 73-yard kick return.
