Marguerite Ileta Goeken Brown, 98, Prairie View, died Oct. 8 at Norton County Hospital.

Mrs. Brown was born Dec. 19, 1906, on a farm south of Edmond to John Peter and Nora Iona (McCormick) Goeken.

She graduated from a country school in Norton County.

As a young woman, she worked in a grocery store in Prairie View. This is where she met her future husband.

On Nov. 11, 1928, she married Burton (Bert) James Brown in Lenora at the home of Fred and Rosalee Brown, her husband's brother and sister-in-law. They lived in Prairie View in the home built by his father, Daniel Brown.

Mrs. Brown was a relief operator for the Rock Island Railroad, serving in many areas in northwestern Kansas. She boarded and fed schoolteachers when they needed a place to stay.

She had been a member of the Methodist Church in Prairie View and transferred her membership to the Prairie View Reformed church.

She was a member of the Bethlehem Chapter No. 89 of the Order of Eastern Star, and a charter member of the Sunshine Leaders Extension Home Unit. She was instrumental in starting a library in Prairie View, served on the library board and contributed to the publishing of the Prairie View centennial book.

Her hobbies included crocheting, embroidering, knitting, quilting, ceramics, and playing cards.

Preceding her in death was her husband, Burton Brown; a son, Burton James, Jr.; a daughter, Mila

Deane Kimel; a son-in-law, William Kimel; sisters, Lulu Hempler and Nora Goeken; brothers, Lacy Goeken, John Goeken; her twin, Martin Goeken, Max Goeken and James Goeken; and a granddaughter, Karen Faith VanDiest.

Survivors include: her children, Berta and Tom VanDiest, Rose and Ron Snyder, Lois and Drew Poer and Nora and Gary Kats; a brother, Norman and Faye Goeken; a sister, Iva Lee Steinburgen; a sister-in-law, Pauline Goeken; 15 grandchildren; 23 great-grandchildren; and one great-great-grandson.

Funeral services were held Wednesday at Prairie View Reformed Church with the Rev. Jeff Van Der Weele officiating. Michele Melton read a poem. Musical selections included "In The Garden", "His Eye Is On The Sparrow", and "Hymne". Diana Greving was the vocalist, Krista Van Diest played the flute, Hazel Jansonius was the organist and Sara Nelson was also an accompanist.

Casket bearers were Sean Kats, Darren Walters, Mark Poer, Luke Van Diest, Daniel Melton, Michael Van Diest and Zachary Van Diest. The rest of her grandchildren were honorary bearers.

Jay C. Gallentine, 90, Norton, died Thursday at Norton County Hospital.

Mr. Gallentine was born Aug. 9, 1915, to Eli Clark and Jessie Edna (Gallentine) Gallentine in Clayton.

He attended rural schools through the eighth grade and graduated from Norcat Rural High School in 1932.

He and Viola (Anderson) Menges were married Dec. 12, 1962, at the Methodist parsonage in Norcat. They adopted two sons, Randy Jay Gallentine and Val Gene Gallentine. With the exception of spending from March 1942 to Nov. 1945 serving in the Army during World War II, he lived on the farm from birth until July 1977, when he and his family moved to Norton.

Mr. Gallentine worked for ten years, beginning in 1979, with the National Association State Department of Agriculture statistics. After retiring, he enjoyed working in his garden. He and his wife, along with Glen and Florence Conard, performed a variety of programs in various nursing homes. Other pastimes included reading, working word puzzle books and playing solitaire on the computer.
