'We've played them twice, each team winning once. If we match up with them at sub-state, I feel confident in our ability to come out on top if we play our game."



Norton will compete Saturfense kept Stockton from setting day in the Class 3A Sub-State Volleyball Tournament in Phillipsburg.


Also competing in addition to Norton and Phillipsburg will be teams from Holcomb, Cimarron, Lakin, Beloit and Oberlin.
