Norton to play Phillipsburg team here on Thursday

The 6-2 Norton Community High School football team will play 7-1 Phillipsburg in the final Class 3A District 10 contest Thursday in Norton.

Kickoff is set for 7 p.m.

The winner of Thursday's game will be the district champion and will have the home field advantage when playing another district runnerup on Tuesday. The loser will play a district winner and will go on the road.

Norton has lost just to unbeaten, state-ranked and defending state champion Smith Cen-Oakley, both 2A teams.

Phillipsburg's only loss is to Smith Center.

The Panthers have a lot of speed in the backfield. One of their speedsters is 5-feet, 10-inch, 164-pound junior Jarrett Abell. He was named a first-team return specialist and second-team kicker on last year's All-Mid-Continent League team. Abell rushed for 546 yards and 11 touchdowns last season and had seven touchdowns on special teams.

Phillipsburg defeated Thomas More Prep of Hays 53-22 in district play on Friday. Abell had a 30-yard pass interception for a touchdown in that game.

Another Panther speedster is 5-9, 171-pound senior running back and linebacker Travis Yoxall. He was a second-team all-league running back last season. He rushed for 622 yards and 11 touchdowns last season and had 64 tackles and three pass interceptions on defense.

Yoxall scored on touchdowns of 40 yards, 39 yards and 19 yards against Thomas More and he rushed for 105 yards on just six carries.

Another returning all-league player for Phillipsburg is 5-10, 164 pound senior quarterback and defensive back Taylor Redinger. He was a first-team all-league defensive back last year. Redinger scored once players on both offense and defense against Thomas More.

Cody Jarvis, a 5-10, 196- needed rest in games. backer, was second team allleague center last year.

Senior fullback Brandon Karlin, a 5-11, 222-pound bruiser, also scored for the Panthers Friday.

Norton defeated Thomas More by 21-0 the Friday before but statistics in the two games are interesting. Norton had 260 yards

rushing and 39 passing for 299 total yards. Phillipsburg had 303 yards rushing, 38 passing for 341

On defense, Norton limited Thomas More to 84 yards rushing and 19 passing for 103 total. Phillipsburg held the Monarchs to 87 rushing but allowed 159 passing for a 246 yard total.

In the win over Russell, Norton junior tailback Blake VanEaton remained the all-purpose yards leader for the Blue Jays. He ran for 133 yards, caught one pass for 62 yards and returned one kickoff for 19 ter and unbeaten, state-ranked yards. For the season he has rushed for 659 yards, caught 197 yards in passes and returned kickoffs for 199 yards for a total of 1,055 yards of offense or 132 yards per game average.

Senior quarterback Luke Pfannenstiel has completed 41 of 85 passes for a 48 percent completion rate and 617 total yards.

Senior linebacker Lance Roe continues to lead the Blue Jays in tackles. He has 44 solos, 22 assists for 66 total tackles. Junior linebacker VanEaton has 41 solos, 16 assists for 57 total stops and junior defensive back Nathan Broeckelman has 46 solos, 8 assists for 54 total.

"We have a great opportunity Thursday night against Phillipsburg but we'll have to play awfully well to win," said Norton Coach Bruce Graber.

"They have lots of speed and talent. They are confident and they will come in here ready to win.

"We have a history of winning district champions hips so it wouldbe sweet to get another one.

"Special teams will be huge. We won special teams when we won the battle with them a year ago. Our defense played great in that game. We'll have to win the special teams and eliminate their big plays. We've found more consistency defensively and need to get more consistent on offense. Lately, we've been able to rotate more and that has given our players some

Norton boys cross country second in 3A Regional Meet

The Norton Community High School boys cross country team won a trip to the state meet as they placed second in the Class 3A Cross Country Regional Meet on Saturday in Ellsworth.

The girls team finished ninth with one girl winning an individual berth at state after placing in the top five.

The top three boys and girls teams and top ten runners plus top five individuals from non-qualifying teams if they were not included in the top ten qualified for the State Meet at Wamego this Saturday.

Southeast of Saline won the boys championship with 60 points, followed by Norton, 80; Holcomb, 91; Sacred Heart of Salina, 105; Hoisington, 112; Beloit, 135; Lakin, 177; Phillipsburg, 254; Lyons, 260; Bennington, 274; Ellinwood, 287; Cimarron, 303; Oberlin, 315; Ellsworth, 0.

Norton freshman Zach Bainter placed fourth overall and third among team runners in the boys three-mile course with a time of 17 minutes, 48 seconds.

Blue Jay junior Kent Mann, who has been hampered by illness, placed 11th overall and ninth among team runners with a season's best time of 18:24. His previous best was 18:26 at Trego.

Others were Junior Logan Keiswetter, 16th overall, 14th in team runners, at 18:44; junior Jared Engelbert, 26th overall, 24th in team runners, at 19:19; junior Jared Bebb, 32nd overall, 30th in team runners, 19:36.

Also placing for the Blue Jays were freshman Coady Nickell, 35th,19:41, and sophomore Luke VanSkike, 55th, 20:56.

"I and a lot of young men who have run for me along with seven running for me now have been waiting six years for this moment," said Coach Deyton Hager.

"We ran hard in a tough regional to qualify for the state meet. We have been working for the last two weeks on just running with a teammate who has been right in front of each of them all year and running a series of 20 minute runs just on hills. It seemed to work for us in
