
He was preceded in death by his brothers, John Dobberstein, August Dobberstein and Charles Dobberstein.

Her work environment is soothing and peaceful. Classical music plays softly on the sound system, a scented candle flickers. Yet, massage therapist Camille Cox really puts some muscle into her work.


Have I fulfilled my purpose? What will I be remembered for? What kind of a legacy have I passed along to my family and others?


