County gives property to township

Norton County gave the Solomon Township a piece of property in Densmore last week.

The property has been under dispute because of a water well on it.

"We have treated that like an international treaty," County Councilor Doug Sebelius said of the agreement. "It's finally come together."

He said that the county will give the township the property but suggested that it enter into an easement agreement with the water user as soon as the title is cleared.

The water user, a couple, has put a pump on the property, he said, but their property isn't adjacent to the property in question.

Mr. Sebelius said that the easement for use of the water should end with the deaths of the users.

The property will probably be sold, he said, but for a short period of time the township has committed to taking care of the problem. The property had belonged to

the West Union Township. However, in the 1970s when the townships were consolidated, West Union was disbanded and the county ended up getting the property by default.

"This should have been done 30 years ago," Mr. Sebelius said of the county disposing of the property. "We never had anything to do with any of this."

Commissioner John Miller remembered a couple of other pieces of property that the county found out it owned and gave away recently.

"Sort of like East Campus and the (practice) football field belonged to the county," he noted.

While the property has little value for the county, Mr. Miller said, it's important to the people involved.

In other business, the commissioners:

- Heard from Commissioner John Miller about two meetings he attended — the Kansas Association of Counties Legislative Plat-

form Committee in Topeka and a geographic information system meeting for Solomon Valley Resource Conservation and Development in Stockton.

- Talked to Sheriff Troy Thomson, the county's emergency preparedness officer, about 911 addressing.

Sheriff Thomson said that he has checked with the Kansas Emergency Management Association and it has no guidelines for setting up a system so he will be checking the national organization.

"Just put it on hold for a while," Commissioner Leroy Lang said, "We don't know what we're doing."

- Heard from Road and Bridge Supervisor Tom Brannan that the county's new groomer seems to be working well.

The groomer pulls the gravel from the sides of the road and ditches back into the center, he said.
