"Returning four starters from a 17-5 team has to put you among the favorites to win the league title. Osborne and Phillipsburg will also contend for the top spot with Ellis being a dark horse."

Coach Jilka is beginning his 24th season as head coach of the Lady Blue Jays. During his tenure, the Norton girls have won 398 games and have lost 128 for a 76 percent winning average.

The 2000-'01 team compiled an 18-7 record en route to a fourth place finish in the Class 3A state tournament.

Coach Jilka's 2001-'02 Lady Jays finished 13-9 and placed fourth in the league. After losing eight seniors from that squad, Coach Jilka had to start over in the 2002-'03 season with only three returning letter winners, none of whom were starters. The Lady Jays finished just 4-16 that season.

Norton compiled a 12-9 record in 2003-'04. They had a 7-2 record in the league, which tied them for second in the league with Trego behind champion Smith Center, who was undefeated in league play. Norton was seeded No.5 in the sub-state tournament at the end of the season and played No.4 seed Beloit in the first round. An exciting game on the Lady Trojans' home floor ended in a 56-49 overtime loss to end Norton's season.

The season ended for the 2004-05 team with a loss to Holcomb in the semi-finals of the sub-state tournament, which was won by Holcomb.

# Norton boys return two letterwinners

The Norton Community High boys basketball team compiled a 15-7 record last season en route to a second place tie in the Mid-Continent League race and third place in the league tournament.

Norton lost 50-47 in the substate semi-finals to Thomas More Prep of Hays to end the Jays' season. Thomas More won the tournament and continued on to win the Class 3A State Championship.

Coach Doug Reusink has just two returning lettermen from last season. They are Heath Vincent, 6-foot, 6-inch senior center, who averaged 9.9 points and 6 rebounds per game and Nathan Morse, 6-0 senior guard, who averaged 5.4 points and 2.4 rebounds per game.

"We're coming into the season with very little experience with just two returning starters and no other lettermen," said Coach Reusink.

"Early in the season, we will probably lean on Heath Vincent and Nathan Morse to make plays

for us. We'll need others to develop quickly for us to have any chance of success.

"Our players are working hard in practice and they will get better as the season progresses. We have a lot of players new to our program but they are a good group to work with.

"Ottawa will be an excellent team. We'll learn a lot about ourselves during the three days of the Goodland tournament."

Coach Reusink said he felt that Plainville, Phillipsburg and Trego should be the strongest teams in the Mid-Continent League based on the players they have returning.

"I'm sure, there will be other quality teams pushing them," he said. "I guarantee there will be no easy game in the league for us this year."

Under the leadership of Coach Reusink, the Blue Jay boys are always competitive. The 2002-'03 team won the Class 3A state basketball championship with a 22-5 record and the 2003-'04 Blue Jay squad was also outstanding, compiling an 18-4 record.

Coach Reusink's overall record in Norton is 180 wins and 126 losses. He is beginning his 27th year of coaching high school boys teams and has compiled an overall record of 394 wins and 172 losses for an outstanding 69.6 percent victory record. This is an average of 15 wins and 6.6 losses per year.
