Norton girls are champions of Goodland tourney

The Norton Community High girls basketball team not only hit 15 of 20 free throws en route to a 47-33 championship win over Goodland in the Topside Tipoff Tournament in Goodland on Saturday but won the team free throw competition award as well.

In three games, the Norton quintet hit 30 of 46 charities for 65 percent. Their 15 of 20 against Goodland averaged 75 percent.

In the championship win over previously unbeaten Goodland (4-1), the Lady Jays needed every point. Both teams hit two shots from beyond the arc and 13 twopointers. Goodland hit just one of five free throws and that was the

Norton held a slim 13-12 lead after one quarter. Norton's points came on four of four free throws and two baskets by senior center Chelsea Cox, a three-point basket by freshman guard Laura Lee Baird and two-point basket by senior center Becca Ebert.

The Lady Jays outscored the Lady Cowboys 15-9 in the second quarter to take a 28-21 half-time lead. Ebert led Norton scoring in the period with two baskets and two of two free throws. Baird hit another three-point basket and a two-pointer. Senior guards Klaire Mann and Amber Overlease also hit baskets.

The second half was a defensive battle with both teams hitting just five field goals. The Lady Jays outscored the Lady Cowboys 8-5 in the third period. Ebert hit two more baskets and Cox and sophomore center Chantille Campbell hit a basket apiece to extend the Norton lead to 36-26.

Goodland 11-7 in the final stanza

hit Norton's only basket of the quarter but senior guard Karlie Jones connected on four of four free throws, Ebert hit four of five charities and senior guard Whitney Newell hit one of two free tosses.

"We played great on offense," said Coach Kevin Jilka. "They play great defense and we had only 12 turnovers.

"We played with great poise when they cut down our lead and their crowd got into it. This was a great situation to prepare us for this type of environment in the future.

"I'm very, very proud of our girls. They really stepped up and played well against a good team. We gave a great effort.

"We did an outstanding job of hitting our free throws and our bench came in and played well again."

Ebert was leading scorer for the 3-0 Lady Jays with 16 points on five of 10 two-point shots for 50 percent and six of seven free throws for 86 percent. Cox ended with 12 points on four of 12 from the field for 33 percent and a perfect four of four free throws.

Baird tallied 8 on two of three from long range for 67 percent, one of one two-point shots and three of four overall for 75 percent accuracy.
