Paul R. Stutterheim, 94, Golden, Colo., formerly of Norton, died Sunday, at Bear Creek Nursing and Rehabilitation Center, Morrison, Colo. Mr. Stutterheim purchased an interest in the Reich Grain Co. and continued to operate it for several
