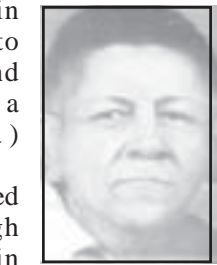
Mr. Jimenez was born Jan. 20, 1937, in Atchison, to Lucio and Jacinta (Gurrola) Jimenez.
