Ellen Naomi Anderson, 92, died Thursday at the Andbe Home in Norton.  
The daughter of William Louis Jr. and Carrie Rebecca (Hughes) Collins, she was born April 19, 1913, near Reager.  
She attended the Reager School District and graduated from Norcat Rural High School in 1931. She took further training and later taught school.  
On Oct. 4, 1936, she and Ernest L. Anderson were married. They made their home on the Anderson family farm one mile west of Devezes. There they farmed and raised their family. In 1973, they moved into Norton. Mr. Anderson died Oct. 27, 1987. Following his death, Mrs. Anderson moved to Bella Vista, Ark. She returned to Norton in 2004.  
She was very active in her church and spent 3,000 hours as a Red Cross volunteer at the Andbe Home. While in Arkansas, she also volunteered at the Gravette Medical Center until she was 90 years

old. She loved to travel and saw most of the United States especially when she accompanied her husband to many state and national soil conservation meetings.  
She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, one daughter-in-law, Linda Anderson, six brothers, Lewis, Elwood, Littleton "Pete", Theron, John, and Henry, and one sister, Minnie Collins.  
Survivors include: her son, E. Louis Anderson, Norton; one sister, Effie Robbins, LaGrange, Calif.; three grandchildren; and seven great-grandchildren.

Mr. Sloan was born July 25, 1950, in Norton, the son of Arthur T. and Anna (Boyd) Sloan.  
He was a 1968, graduate of Norton Community High School.  
He received a bachelor's degree from Kansas State University in 1972, and also had graduate hours in education from the University of Kansas.  
He was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints in Lawrence, the Lawrence Chapter of Kansas National Education Association and the Lawrence Retired Teachers' Association.  
Mr. Sloan had taught English and the Humanities at Lawrence High School for 33 years and retired in May 2005. He received numerous teaching awards, teaching 17 different courses in English

and the Humanities. He was the Assistant Pep Club Sponsor for 12 years and coached the Scholar's Bowl for 13 years. In May 1993, he was selected as the eighth recipient of the Allen Press Distinguished Teacher Award at the school. Mr. Sloan was recognized by the University of Kansas College of Liberal Arts and Sciences as a teacher who profoundly influenced his student's academic lives. At his retirement last year, Mr. Sloan said, "I loved teaching because it allowed me to learn from the literature, from students, and from my colleagues.
