Food specialist gives tips to help keep foods warm

If you're preparing several foods that get "done' at different times, you often can successfully hold most hot foods for about 15 to 20 minutes in a preheated oven set to 200 to 250 degrees F. For longer holding periods, the U.S. Department of Agriculture advises "Set oven temperature high enough to keep the hot food at 140 degrees F or above. Check internal temperature of food with a meat thermometer."
