

Huge fourth quarter lifts Norton girls past Goodland

Community High School girls come-from-behind 39-38 victory at Goodland on Tuesday evening!

Norton handed the Cowgirls their first loss of the season in the championship of the Topside Tipoff Tournament by a 47-33 score on Dec. 10 in Goodland but the return trip by the Lady Jays was a much different ball game.

The two teams were tied 4-all after one quarter but Goodland took a 16-10 lead by halftime and extended it to 30-19 by the end of the third period.

"We went to a full court man-toman defense in the fourth quarter and that seemed to get us going,' said Coach Jilka.

Norton outscored Goodland 20-8 in the fourth quarter. The Lady Jays trailed 38-37 with less than 30 seconds remaining in the contest. Senior guard Karlie Jones shot from the baseline and missed. The ball bounced off the rim and appeared to be going out of bounds. A Goodland player tried to keep the ball in bounds, and did, but unintentionally knocked it back into Jones' hands. She shot the ball up and in to put the Lady Jays ahead for the first time in the game with 15 seconds left on the scoreboard clock.

The Cowgirls brought the ball downcourt and Norton defenders tied up the ball but the arrow pointed in Goodland's direction, allowing them to retain possession. The Cowgirls got off two shots but both missed as the final buzzer sounded with Norton leading 39-38!

Norton freshman Laura Lee Baird scored 10 points in the game and all of them came in the fourth quarter where she hit two from beyond the arc and two two-point baskets. Norton senior center Chelsea Cox hit two field goals, senior guard Whitney Newell scored on a field goal and Jones hit two free throws in the quarter in addition to her game-winning basket.

Goodland hit just three baskets in the fourth quarter. Whitney Ar-Koehler added a free throw.

"This was a huge win for us," said Coach Jilka. "We're not sure how we did it but our girls did it.

"Offensively, we still aren't shooting the ball well but tonight our girls at least took the ball to the basket, which was a good sign.

"Defensively, our girls never quit.

'We are so proud of them for coming back after our loss in the Mid-Continent League Tournament finals. Hopefully, this will jump start us for the rest of the season.'

The Lady Jays suffered their first loss of the season on Saturday night when they were beaten 50-37 by Ellis for the MCL Tournament championship. Norton is now 11-1 for the season and Goodland dropped to 11-4.

Cox was leading scorer for Norton with 13 points on 6 of 8 from the field for a sizzling 75 percent accuracy and was a perfect 1 of 1 from the charity stripe.

Baird was second leading scorer for the Lady Jays with 2 of 3 from long range for 67 percent, 2 of 4 two-point shots for 50 percent and 4 of 7 overall for 57 percent accuracy and 10 points.

Koehler led Goodland in scor- Norton girls 39 ing with 11 points. Swager added 8 and Archer hit 7.

As a team, Norton swished 2 of V 7 from long range for 29 percent, 14 of 41 two-point shots for 34 percent and 16 of 48 overall for 33 percent.

"This was a thrilling night for the Lady Jays," said Norton Coach George Rossi.

"The varsity fired up the junior varsity. Our junior varsity really played a solid game. The score was back and forth. We would get a lead, lost it and regain it again.

"All of our girls gave a great defensive effort. Every game we find new areas to work on. These are hard working girls."
