Norton girls defeat Ellis to earn league title

Coach Kevin Jilka's Norton Community High School girls basketball team had something to prove on Friday night when they traveled to Ellis for their final Mid-Continent League game of the season with the league title on the line.

And they did with a 46-31 win over the Lady Railroaders, who handed them their only previous

The loss to Ellis came in the championship finals of the MCL Tournament on January 21 in Hays. No.1 seeded Norton lost 50-37 to No.3 seeded Ellis.

After that contest, Coach Jilka commented, "We didn't play well in any phase of the game." On Friday night, the Lady Jays

looked like a different team and proved that, not only could they play with Ellis, they could beat them soundly. Norton doubled the score on Ellis

in the first quarter and led 14-7 at

that point. Then, the Lady Jays poured in 19 points while holding the Lady Railroaders to 4 in the second quarter to triple their lead to 33-11 at intermission. It was hard for the Lady Jays to maintain the same momentum in the second half but they led 37-19

after three quarters and ended with a comfortable 15-point victory. "We played better defense this time and shot the ball better, especially from the three-point line,"

said Coach Jilka. "Our girls had something to prove after the loss to Ellis in the tournament. They were a little embarrassed by the loss.

Senior Jaymi Riedel hit a free throw for Ellis but senior guard Whitney Newell answered with a basket from beyond the arc and Norton led 22-8 with 5:02 left in the period. Baird hit a two-point basket, senior guard Klaire Mann ripped the nets from two-point land and senior guard Karlie Jones radared in a long range shot. Baird intercepted an in-bounds pass and scored with 3:01 remaining.

Another three-point basket by Baird with 1:15 left in the half extended the Lady Jay lead to 33-8. Taylor hit a free throw and Pfeifer hit a basket in the final minute to narrow the Lady Jay advantage to 33-11 at halftime.


