

Cheyenne Conference held meet in Logan

Northern Valley boys, Logan girls teams win

The Cheyenne Conference League Track Invitational was held May 11 in Logan.

On the boys side, Northern Valley took first with 142 points, followed by Kensington in second with 123 and Logan in third at 97. Next were Palco, 74; Western Plains, 62; and Eastern Heights, 50.

Norton golf team third in Mid-Continent Tournament

Coach David Stover's Norton Community High School golf team placed third in the annual Mid-Continent League Golf Tournament hosted by Stockton and played on the Rooks County Course on Thursday.

Phillipsburg was the champion and shot a six-man score of 496. Trego Community placed runnerup with a 503 and Norton was third with a 527. Fourth place went to Plainville with a 549, followed by Ellis, 555; Osborne, 573; Stockton, 578; Smith Center, 615.

Norton was also third in four-man competition. Phillipsburg won with a 323, followed by Trego, 337; Norton, 343; Hill City, 353; Plainville, 357; Ellis, 387; Osborne, 388; Stockton, 434; Smith Center, 445.

Trego won the two-man play with a 166, followed by Stock-

ton, 169; Ellis, 170; Phillipsburg, 173; Osborne, 188; Smith Center, 190; Plainville, 192; Norton, 197.

Norton's four-man players and scores were: senior Clay Madden, 38-45-83; senior Dane Krizek, 38-46-84; senior Jordan Herman, 46-42-88; junior Michael Ward, 43-45-88. Sophomore Preston Herman also played and shot a 41-47-88.

Norton's two-man team scores were sophomore Kyle Edgett, 51-45-96 and junior Pat Burton, 51-50-101. Also playing for the Blue Jay two-man team was senior Blake Jacques who shot a 56-52-108.

Individual medalists were: Aaron Roberts, Hill City, 75; Jeff Jarvis, Phillipsburg, 77; Nathan Locke, Trego, 81; Brandon Karlin, Phillipsburg, 82; Adam Augustine, Ellis, 82; Travis Yoxall, Phillipsburg, 82; Rory Fossom, Trego, 82; Nolan Smith, Trego,

82; William Keesee, Phillipsburg, 82; Joseph Monroe, Phillipsburg, 83.

"We played good golf at times today but Phillipsburg and Trego played great golf on their way to the championship and runnerup," said coach Stover.

"We put ourselves in contention with a very good front nine but, as has been the case much of the season, we couldn't put together two solid nines and fell out of team contention.

"We are continuing to see improvement but now is the time we need to put it all together.

"Individually, Clay Madden narrowly missed out on medalist honors, losing the final medalist honors in a card playoff. Kyle Edgett finished his season with a career best round.

"This sets up an exciting Regional Golf Tournament in Phillipsburg on Monday."
