

# 'Jay' golfer competes at state

Norton senior Dane Krizek competed in the Class 3A State Golf Tournament on Monday at Hesston Golf Park in Hesston.

He shot an outstanding 38 on his front nine holes but a 47 on the back nine gave him an 85 and put him out of the medalist running.

"Although he was disappointed with the outcome, I was very proud of the way Dane competed," said Norton head coach David Stover.

"He played well on the front nine but it just wasn't meant to be today. Dane has battled adversity all season. He finished by playing some of the best golf of his career, topped by winning the regional championship last week.

"Not only Dane but the entire Norton golf team has improved greatly from the beginning of the season. Although we will miss seniors Dane, Clay Madden, Jordan Herman, Blake Jacques, Tyler Neff and Greg Wilson, the experience we have earned this season should lead to bigger and better things in the future."

# Trego wins state golf championship

Trego Community High School in WaKeeney won the 2006 Class 2A state golf championship on Monday at the Sugar Hills Golf Club in Goodland.

Rory Fossum, Nathan Locke and Matt Pfannenstiel finished among the top seven medalists in leading the Golden Eagles to the

golf title, their first since 1967.

Trego recorded a 324 team score to finish 10 strokes ahead of second place St. John. Pittsburg Colgan was third with a 336.

Fossum was fourth medalist with a 78 while Locke was fifth with a 79 and Pfannenstiel was seventh with an 80. Nolan Smith rounded out Trego's scoring with

a 90. Stockton's Heath Muir was 12th medalist with an 81.

It was Trego's second state championship of the 2005-06 season.

The Golden Eagles also won the Class 2A state basketball championship.

# Area athletes competing at state track meet

High school track and field athletes from Norton, Northern Valley, Logan and Jennings will compete today and Saturday in the State Track and Field Meet at Cessna Stadium in Wichita.

Competition was to begin at 8 a.m. today and resumes at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday.

The top four placers in last Friday's regional meets qualified for state.

Norton qualified 11 athletes in 12 events.

Lady Blue Jays qualifying in Class 3A were freshman Hayli Bozarth, first, shot put, 34-feet-9-inches; second, discus, 114'8", personal best; freshman Laura Lee Baird, second, 400 meter dash, 59.20; fourth, 800 meter run, 2:25.6; sophomore Courtney LeClair, second, 100 meter hurdles, 15.70 (set personal best of 15.03 in preliminaries); fourth, 300 meter hurdles, 48.40, personal best; senior Chelle Donovan, second, pole vault 9';

junior Lacey Roe, fourth, javelin, 108'9".

Norton boys qualifying were junior Blake VanEaton, first, 400 meter dash, 51.30; VanEaton, junior Jared Engelbert, freshman Zach Bainter and junior Logan Keiswetter, third, 3200 meter relay, 8:27.70, season's best; junior Kent Mann, third, 1600 meter run, 4:43.00; senior Lance Roe, second, pole vault, 12'.

Three athletes from Northern Valley qualified for the state meet in Class 1A. They are Clarke Nelson, Joey Copper and Joni Hilburn.

Nelson and Hilburn both won the pole vault at the regional meet. Nelson had a height of 12' and Hilburn cleared 8'6".

Copper placed fourth in the 110 meter hurdles in 15.7.

Seven athletes from Logan High School qualified for the state meet. Tim McElroy won the discus with a throw of 151'1" and placed fourth in the shot put with a heave of 48'10". Zach Long

cleared 11'6" to place third in the pole vault.

Anne Hartman placed third in the 200 meter dash with a time of 27.4 and third in the 400 meter dash in 1:03.1. Bethany Clements finished in second place in the 800 meter run in 2:28.7.

The Lady Trojans also qualified two relay teams for state competition. The 1600 meter relay team of Clements, Hartman, Shelley Kemper and Jenny Archer placed third with a clocking of 4:24.3 and the 400 meter relay team of Clements, Kemper, Hartman and Darci Goddard finished fourth in 52.5.

Marcus McKenna of Jennings, who attends school in Hoxie, also qualified for the state meet as a member of the Hoxie team. He placed second in the Class 2A regional meet in Hill City in the 800 meter run with a time of 2:05.20. McKenna is also a member of Hoxie's 3200 meter relay team which placed second in 8:38.60.

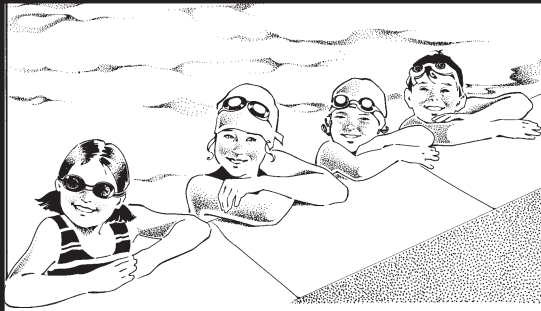
