# Familiar faces in Norton's victory lane

Elmwood Park Speedway in Norton saw some familiar faces in victory lane after racing action was complete Saturday evening, June 24.

The drive of the night came from Kensington's Josh Hudson in the IMCA Stock Car division. After being involved in a multi-car tangle in his heat race, Hudson had to limp to the pits to make repairs for the feature. Hudson then started scratch in the 12-car field for the 18-lap event. Jason McCartney led the first 4 laps before Tyler Hahn took command. Hahn led at the halfway mark of the race, followed closely by Cory Struckhoff, Jason Davis, McCartney, and Jason Rogers. Struckhoff then took the point on lap 13, only to spin one lap later and go to the back of the line on the restart. That gave Hahn the lead back, followed by Davis and Hudson, who had worked his way to third. On lap 16, Hudson made his move to the front and held on to score his second win of the season at the half-mile oval. Davis finished second, followed by Rogers, Hahn, and J.R. McCreery. Heat race winners were Jason Schoenberger and Davis.

David Murray Jr. of Oberlin won his fifth IMCA Modified feature of the season at Norton. Hometown driver Rick Schwab

led the opening lap before the red flag flew on lap 2 when Mitch Kline rolled his #08 on the backstretch. Mitch was not hurt but the car was done for the evening. After the restart, Nate Schaben took the lead on lap 3, only to be passed by Schwab 2 laps later. At the halfway mark of the 15-lap race, Schaben jumped back out front but motor problems sent him to the pits two laps later. Murray worked his way through the field and took the top spot on lap 11. The lone caution flag of the race came on lap 13 when race officials issued a rough driving penalty to Murray, docking him 2 spots, lining him up behind Schwab and Brian Calhoon on the restart. But Murray charged back in front on lap 13 and drove away the final two laps for the victory. Calhoon got by Schwab to finish second, with Jason Schoenberger and Jeff Walters rounding out the top five. Murray and Kline won the two heat races.

Gene Sneath of Plainville won his third IMCA Hobby Stock feature in a row at Elmwood Park. Sneath took the lead on lap 3 from Jerry Hudson and never looked back in the 12-lap race. Brady Schoen made a late charge but had to settle for second, followed by Kelly Karnopp, heat two winner Adam Balthazor, and Wade Wagenblast. Dustin McClurg won

the other heat race. Heat race winners Wes and Chuck Eagleburger of Norton led all 8 laps of the Cruiser feature to score their second win of the season at their hometown track. Point leaders Macy and Kimberly Thomas finished second, followed by Nick & Tim Horn.

Racing action returns to Elmwood Park Speedway Saturday night, July 8, with the regular four divisions, along with GOTRA (Good Ol' Timers Racing Association). Race time is 7 p.m.
