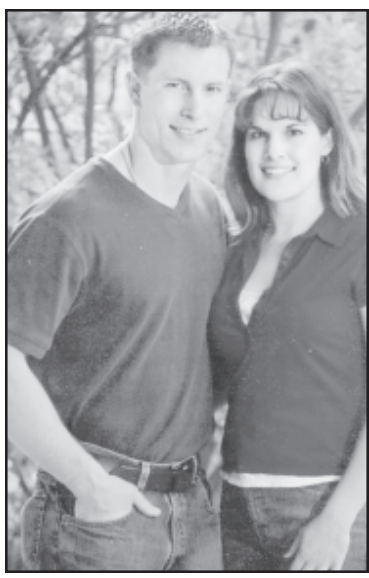

HANSEN MUSEUM

Museum staff is in the process this week of putting up the new exhibit, "No Guts, No Glory" of the Museum Presentation Associates Touring Exhibitions. This exhibit of 50 black and white photographs will open on July 7, and run through Sept. 24.

Louise Serpa, a rodeo photographer based in Tucson, Ariz., has been battered, bruised, blindsided and left black and blue. At 80-some years old, with hundreds of rodeos under her cowgirl belt, she has war stories to tell.

An angry 1,600-pound bull once charged her, then picked her up by the seat of her pants and threw her in the air like she was a toy. She cracked her sternum and two top ribs. On another occasion, Ms. Serpa was shooting pictures from underneath the bottom rung of a fence when a bull smashed into the structure, causing the wooden boards to collapse on her. Knocked out cold, she awoke with a banana-shaped bump on her head.

Showing in conjunction with these photographs will be photos

from Bill Foster called "Horse Gear". Mr. Foster has his own share of good and bad horse stories. The last one being a ride taken on his 85th birthday, which left him in the hospital for three weeks. That outlaw went to the "killer plant".

The "Omer Knoll: Sculptor, Artist and Designer" exhibit has been taken down. Mr. Knoll lives at Palco and so when you are down that way, stop in and see him. He loves to show his art and tell the stories of each piece.

Bruce Bitter of B & B Metalworks Shop from Hoisington, is the June "Artist of the Month". Mr. Bitter uses a hand-held plasma torch to make the intricate cuts required in his ranch life metalwork designs. He has been cutting designs from a variety of metals for 10 years and travels to 50 shows per year from Kansas to Las Vegas to Oregon.
