Home-grown is the way to go

Late August is a busy time of year at our house. Mama is always in the kitchen with half a dozen projects going at different stages. Our library books lie unread; new magazines are stacked under the radio table to be perused later; the first-day-of-school dress is folded half constructed on the sewing machine.

We are putting food up for the winter while it is available. Dad is digging potatoes and onions each evening when he comes home, no matter how tired he may be. I help spread them to dry on old window screens propped on cinder blocks. Sparkling jars of canned food are filling up the empty shelves in the fruit room downstairs - green beans, tomatoes, beets both plain and pickled and tiny sweet lime pickles. Bread and butter pickles, homemade chili sauce and catsup have been put down for their six-week seasoning. Earlier in the summer Mama put up peaches, pears, apples and plums so we shall have the flavors of summer all winter long.

The garden is looking ragged and ratty. We are in full harvest mode. A few leaves are starting to turn in anticipation of autumn. While there is still shade, Roger and I sit on the back lawn surrounded with dried onions and heaps of nylon hose with runs. Into the toe of a stocking we drop an onion, tie a tight knot, another onion, another knot on and on. The resulting lumpy strings will be hung from the garage rafters. Some years, the crop lasts clear of soups. through to spring.

smell. Roger grins and says "Mom's workin' on all those sand plums we picked down at the crick Sunday. Bet we have waffles and hot plum jam for supper."

Mama made chokecherry jell yesterday so I speculate there'll be some of that, too, since it is Dad's favorite. He always teases Mama that the tart fruit puckers her up for a sweet kiss. Jewel-toned apricot, cherry and rhubarb jam are already stored away for the year and I know this next weekend will be our wild grape excursion to make purple jelly. And my all-time favorite spread, tomato preserves, are all made and I am waiting eagerly for the first jar to be opened. No commercial jams or jellies for this family.

Dad, our official quality control department, shows up with his arms full of gunny sacks to be used for potato storage. He comes out to inspect and approve the onion strings before heading in to try the jam. Shortly he is back out to start picking dry bean pods which will also cure on the window screens until they are crispy enough to husk. Big butter beans are best because they go fast compared to pintos and little white beans. Several gallon glass jars are reserved to store beans for a winter's worth

them downstairs to store against the coal room walls along with a few pie pumpkins. Tomatoes and pickles have been

canned periodically all summer. Come close to frost in late September or early October all the vines will be stripped of green tomatoes and giant cucumbers to be ground up for chow-chow, relish and piccallili. Green cherry tomatoes will be made into Mama's dilled tomato pickles and a large bag of big green fruit will be taken to a neighbor who loves to make green tomato pie. Not a vegetable will go to waste around here.


We finish the onions and begin laying garlic heads into small, flat boxes saved for that purpose. Not a big crop this year and Roger and I are both glad to wash the smell off our hands when Mama calls us in for supper. Not waffles, but even better, French toast.


"Honestly, Arthur," Mama says, "sometimes it's almost embarrassing to go to the market when all I buy is salt, flour and sugar!"






