Streetside is a vocal group of four harmonizing hunks. Originally an acapella quintet in high school, the current four members (together since 1988) perform a 50/50 mix of both acapella and keyboard accompanied songs. Primarily performing doo-wop music from the 50s and 60s, they have expanded their repertoire over the years to also include country, gospel and more modern pop songs.

Norton City Electrical Current Rate Ordinance

Published in The Norton Telegram on Tuesday, August 8, 2006. (1T)

ORDINANCE NO. 1553
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 15-305, 15-306, 15-307 AND 15-308 OF THE NORTON CITY CODE RELATING TO ELECTRICAL CURRENT RATES.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF NORTON, KANSAS:

Section 1: Section 15-305 of the Code of the City of Norton is hereby amended to read as follows:

15-305. RATES: RESIDENTIAL. Rates per meter for residential electrical current for lighting and other domestic purposes furnished by the City shall be paid monthly by the consumer of such electrical current at the City Clerk's office, as follows:

Effective August 1st, 2006, the rates shall be as follows:

For the first 80 kwh per month, at 17.69 cents per kwh

For the next 120 kwh per month, at 10.61 cents per kwh

Excess over 200 kwh per month, at 9.91 cents per kwh provided that no flat rate shall be applied or allowed and that the minimum commercial electrical service billing rate shall be \$4.00 per month per meter and that if any customer shall have more than one meter employed, separate billings for each such meter kwh reading shall be calculated and made.

Section 2: Section 15-306 of the Code of the City of Norton is hereby amended to read as follows:

15-306. RATES: COMMERCIAL. Rates per meter, for commercial,

industrial and institutional electrical current service for purposes including, but not limited to commercial lighting and appliances, show window lighting and electric advertising signs, commercial heating and cooling, at standard utility service voltages, single phase, three phase or both, furnished by the City, shall be paid monthly by the consumer of such electrical current at the City Clerk's office, as follows:

Effective August 1, 2006, the rates shall be as follows:

For the first 100 kwh per month, at 19.10 cents/kwh;

For the next 900 kwh per month, at 12.03 cents/kwh;

For the next 14,000 kwh per month, at 9.91 cents/kwh;

For the next 25,000 kwh per month, at 8.84 cents/kwh;

For excess over 40,000 kwh per month, 7.43 cents/kwh, provided that no flat rate shall be applied or allowed and that the minimum commercial electrical service billing rate shall be \$4.00 per month per meter and that if any customer shall have more than one meter employed, separate billings for each such meter kwh reading shall be calculated and made.

Section 3: Section 15-307 of the Code of the City of Norton is hereby amended to read as follows:

15-307. SAME: SPACE HEATING. Rates for electric current metered separately for space heating, where area to be heated has a floor space of 400 square feet or more, and hot water heating if wired with the space heating, shall be paid monthly by the consumer of such current as follows: Beginning August 1, 2006, 9.55 cents per kwh, with a minimum monthly charge of \$8.00 per

month payable in advance.

Section 4: Section 15-308 of the Code of the City of Norton is hereby amended to read as follows:

15-308. SAME: COST OF FUEL AND ENERGY EXPENSE: FUEL ADJUSTMENT.

a. Whenever the average cost to the City of electrical energy or fuel for generation of electrical energy, purchased or generated, exceeds the base cost of 6.0 cents per kwh, during the billing period, there shall be applied to the customer's current electrical service bill a fuel adjustment rate which will be amount of the actual cost of fuel or energy per kwh purchased or generated, above the base cost of 6.0 cents per kwh.

b. The foregoing fuel adjustment shall be made to all electrical service rates and shall be made monthly, computed on the fuel and the kwh generated or purchased by the City during the month preceding the month of the electrical service billing. The fuel adjustment costs shall be determined from the cost of natural gas, diesel oil, lubricating oil and energy purchased, if any.

c. The fuel adjustment shall be applied to all classifications of electrical rate schedules and to all municipal electrical service customers.

Section 5: Sections 15-305, 15-306, 15-307 and 15-308 are hereby amended.

Section 6: This ordinance shall be effective upon publication in the official city newspaper.

Livestock registration getting easier

MANHATTAN — The Kansas Farm Service Agency, in partnership with the Kansas Animal Health Department, is making premise identification registration easy and convenient for livestock producers across the state. Trained agency staff is available at Kansas U.S. Department of Agriculture service centers to assist livestock producers with on-line premise registration.

"This partnership with KAHD is an opportunity for Farm Service Agency offices in 103 counties to assist our farm and ranch customers across Kansas," said Bill R. Fuller, state executive director of the Kansas Farm Service Agency. "We are very pleased to have received approval of our proposal to create this partnership between state and federal agencies."

Premise registration is the first step through the Kansas Animal Identification System (KanID) to implement the National Animal Identification System (NAIS) in Kansas. The national system will help protect animal agriculture by providing livestock owners and

animal health officials the infrastructure to reduce the financial and social impacts of potential animal disease outbreaks. The initiative is a state/federal/industry cooperative program intended to identify animal premises, individual animals, and ultimately to track movements of animals in commerce.

Livestock producers in Kansas who would like agency assistance in obtaining a premise ID should visit their local office. Animals included in the KanID are bison, cattle, swine, sheep, goats, horses, poultry, deer, elk and other cervids, llamas, alpacas, and aquaculture. Information necessary to register is name, address, primary and secondary contacts, telephone numbers and in some cases, the legal description of the premise where the livestock is physically located.

While the state's agency staff are ready to assist producers with on-line premise registration, specific program questions should be forwarded to Bryan Rickard, NAIS program manager, Kansas

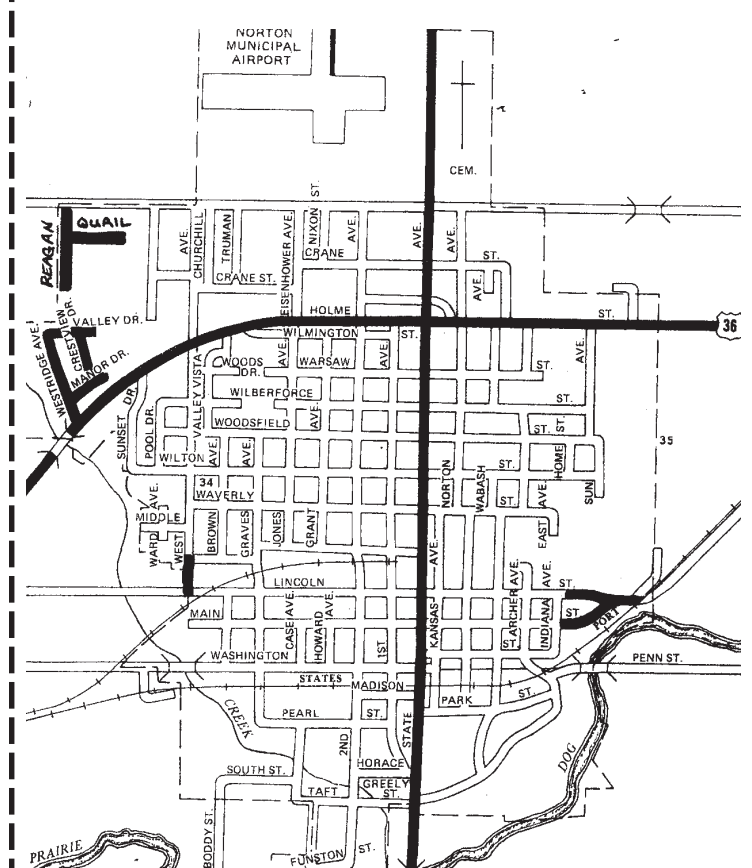
