He had many hobbies, tumbling rocks he found in the desert, making tie tacks from metal and stones and creating bonsai out of rosemary and juniper plants.

"He had projects and energy, from 5 in the morning until 8 at night," Connie said. "He loved his work. He loved his plants, his bonsai. He loved his dogs. He loved everything he did. That's what he meant to me. He was excited about a new day, Born in Norton on Dec. 2,

1927, Ken was the third of four children of Nita and Art Collier, a town barber. After high school, Ken joined the U.S. Marines, played the baritone horn in the Marine marching band and earned the rank of staff sergeant.

Ken graduated with his doctorate degree as a clinical psychologist from the University of Nebraska and worked throughout the West, as a school psychologist in New Mexico, a college instructor in Idaho and a private psychologist in Montana. At one point, Ken enjoyed flying a plane to keep appointments in remote parts of Wyoming. He moved to Yuma in 1986, where he started many programs, including an emergency-response team for the ill adults.

As a child, Ken paid attention as his mother pointed out the Big Dipper, the Little Dipper, new moons and full moons. He obeyed when she told her four children at night to "listen to the silence." He did his chores when told, planting a garden and hanging clothes on the line. He loved music and dancing.

"He was so gentle, so caring about life in general, and about nature," said his older sister, Frankie Holeman, of Norton. "He was just always very spe-

Ken also loved animals. As a child during the Depression, he and Frankie dreamed of a time when no animal would be cold or hungry. As an adult, he stopped his car to pick up a dog running down the middle of an Arizona highway. Ken trained both dogs and horses using the same behavioral techniques he successfully used on people. When he was healthy, his dogs always knew how to sit, and would stay in place anywhere, even across the street. They never ran away.

He wore bolo ties to show off the rocks he loved, and for much of his life, he sported the mustache and beard he first grew to portray a cowboy in a parade in Billings, Mont. He continued to challenge himself throughout his life. Before his illness, he picked up the baritone horn, which he had not played for decades. He planned to paint desert landscapes with water-

"He loved life," Connie said. "He was somebody who really loved life. And, I loved being around him."

Ken is survived by his wife; his sister; two daughters, Carmen Chism, of Maple Valley, Washington, and Conny Collier, of Seattle; and his niece, Karen Burkhardt, of Valley Springs, Calif.


