# Blue Jays dine on Tiger in MCL Friday feast

Coach Lucas Melvin's Norton Community High School football team scored every time they had the ball in the first half, then turned the game over to their junior varsity in the second half in an impressive 48-0 Mid-Continent League win over Stockton on the Tigers' field Friday night.

The Blue Jays rolled up 283 yards rushing, added 47 passing for 330 yards of offense. They averaged over six yards per carry rushing. Meanwhile, the aggressive Norton defense held Stockton to 23 yards rushing, minus three yards passing and 20 total yards of offense. The Tigers rushed for an average of .85 yard per carry.

Norton had 19 first downs and Stockton had two, one coming from a Norton penalty and the other late in the game versus the Blue Jay junior varsity.

Norton's senior tailback Blake VanEaton had another good game as he rushed for 132 yards on eight carries for a 16.5 yards per carry average.

Norton took the opening kickoff and it took the Jays just seven plays to go 58 yards for their first touchdown. Senior fullback Chris Davis carried the ball into the end zone from 14 yards out. Davis also kicked the extra point and it was 7-0 with 9:05 left.

After holding the Tigers, Norton moved 64 yards in six plays for their next score. This time junior tailback Todd Bolt hit paydirt from six yards out. After Davis' kick, it was 14-0 with 4:06 remaining in the first period.

With 9:55 left in the second quarter, the Jays completed a 74 yard drive in nine plays as Bolt hit the end zone again, this time from nine yards out. Davis split the uprights and the Blue Jays lead had been extended to 21-0.

After another three-and-out by the Tigers, Norton drove 44 yards on four plays to score again. This time junior quarterback Logan Kats passed to sophomore tight end Zac Dreher for a 20 yard touchdown. The extra point kick by Davis was wide right and Norton led 27-0 with 6:33 remaining in the first half.

The gang-tackling Norton defense held once again but this time the Stockton punter was tackled on the Stockton 15 yard line before he could punt the ball. Kats passed to

After the ensuing kickoff, Stockton got their second first down before turning the ball over on downs to the fired up Norton junior varsity defense. Sophomore running back Brad Nuzum ran 39 yards for an apparent Norton touchdown but it was called back due to a penalty against Norton.

"We played well," said coach Melvin. "We didn't give them anything and didn't look past them. We did what we had to do to make sure a team not as good as us didn't surprise us.

"We still had some missed tackles but, overall, I was proud of both our varsity and junior varsity players.

"I was glad the junior varsity got to play so much since their game with Stockton on Monday night was canceled due to a lack of Stockton players. So, this was their final game of the season.

VanEaton returned the opening kickoff to the 42 yard line. Davis bulled for eight yards over left tackle, then ran up the middle for a first down on the Stockton 48. After Davis picked up eight more yards, VanEaton ran five to the 35. Then, VanEaton took a pitch from quarterback Kats and ran around left end for a first down on the 20. VanEaton drove to the 14, then Davis found a big hole on a counter off right tackle and scored the Jays' first touchdown of the night.

Davis kicked the extra point and Norton led 7-0 with 9:05 left.


