

Past essays have described the interesting and stronghearted people of Kansas, the state's wheat fields, enchanting diversity in population, the state's beauty and the emotions and pride evoked by that beauty.

The essay contest is judged by a panel of Kansas Professional Communicators (formerly Kansas Press Women). The judges look for originality, creativity and sincerity in expressing pride in the state of Kansas.

The winner will be announced and recognized by the Native Sons and Daughters of Kansas at their annual banquet Jan. 26, 2007 at Maner Conference Center, Topeka. The Kansan of the Year and other honorees will be featured at






