Norton tops on Hoxie mats

Only 10 members of the Norton Community High School wrestling team competed in the annual Hoxie Invitational Tournament on Saturday in the Hoxie High School gymnasium but the Blue Jays still dominated the tournament, winning the championship for the fourth year in a row.

The three-time defending Class 3-2-1A state champions from Norton scored 204 points to easily outdistance second place Oakley, who totaled 148.5 points. Third place went to Plainville with 113, followed by Oberlin, 105; Hoxie, 68; Trego Community, 65; Lakin, 47; Holcomb, 30.

Coach Bill Johnson's Blue Jays compiled an impressive won-loss record of 25-2 and had an exceptional 17-0 pin ratio. Eight of the 10 won individual championships, one placed second and one finished in third place.

Norton champions were: freshman Connor Pfannenstiel, 103; freshman Kaenon Keiswetter, 112: freshman Zane Perez, 119: sophomore Zach Bainter, 125; senior Nathan Broeckelman, 130; senior Kent Mann, 135; senior Blake VanEaton, 152; junior Alex Thomas, 285.

"Freshmen are not seeded in this tournament," said coach Johnson. "But, Kaenon easily won his first two matches, then shutout the No.1 seed Dan Weigel, Plainville, who placed third in the state last season at 103.

"I didn't know how we would do in this tournament with four open spots and a lot of newcomers in our lineup. But, we won some key matches in the semi-finals to give us a commanding lead going into

Kaenon Keiswetter, Nathan Broeckelman and Oakley junior Kelly Younkin, who won the 160 pound championship, tied for the "Outstanding Wrestler" honor for the tournament by vote of the team coaches.
