Defense was the name of the game on Saturday when coach Kevin Jilka's Norton Community High School girls basketball team limited Ottawa to just 27 percent shooting in defeating the Lady Cyclones 50-43 to place third in the 18th annual Topside Tipoff Tournament in Goodland.

Ottawa got off to a good start and led 12-7 after one quarter but Norton limited Ottawa to just 5 points in the second quarter while scoring 15 to take a 22-17 halftime advantage. A 12-6 score in favor of Norton in the third quarter extended the Lady Jay lead to 34-23.

The fourth quarter turned into a free throw contest with Ottawa outscoring Norton 17-16 but it was too little, too late for the Lady Cyclones. Norton hit 7 of 13 charities in the final stanza and Ottawa connected on 12 of 14 from the char-

"This was a huge win for our girls," said coach Jilka.

"The second half, we played a lot better and held our poise much better than against Goodland on

Norton loses game at free throw line

Coach Kevin Jilka's Norton Community High School girls basketball team played Goodland on even terms but sent the Cowgirls to the free throw line too many times in a 46-44 loss in the championship semi-finals of the Topside Tipoff Tournament on Friday in Goodland.

Both teams hit 17 field goals but Norton had a higher shooting percentage. The Lady Jays hit 4 of 10 three-point shots for 40 percent, 13 of 27 two-point tries for 48 percent and 17 of 37 overall for 46 percent. Goodland tallied on 4 of 8 treys for 50 percent, 13 of 34 two-point attempts for 38 percent and 17 of 42 for 40 percent.

From the charity stripe, Norton was 6 of 8 for 75 percent while Goodland hit 8 of 23 for 35 percent and the two extra points needed for the victory.

Norton had 21 fouls in the contest and Goodland had just 13.

Norton held a 9-8 lead after one

16-15 advantage at halftime. Goodland outscored Norton 18-14 in the third period to extend the Cowgirls' lead to 34-29. A 15-12 fourth quarter in the Lady Jays' favor fell just two points short.

"It was a hard fought game but, unfortunately, we came out on the short end," said coach Jilka.

"Offensively, we were very tentative the first half but we executed much better and were much more aggressive in the second half.

"Defensively, we got hammered on the boards. We just can't give up 12 offensive rebounds.

"Our girls came back to take the lead late in the game but we just couldn't hang on. Late game situations were a problem and that is something we will need to correct.


