Moran recently joined members of the Rural Health Care Coalition in a press conference in Washington, D.C., to talk about the introduction of H-CARE, which will help rural health care providers address the challenges associated with delivering quality care close

"Quality health care is not a luxury for people in rural areas it is a necessity," Congressman Moran said. "Unfortunately, the health care systems of rural communities and make access a continuous challenge. This legislation will help Kansans and other viders with the funding needed to keep their doors open."

The H-CARE Act would do the following:

• Authorize health information technology grants for rural practi-

• Require prompt payment to rural pharmacies by Medicare prescription drug plans

 Ensure adequate rural representation on the Medicare Payment Advisory Commission

• Establish a Rural Heath Quality Advisory Commission

• Establish a Rural Community Hospital Program to help midsize hospitals recover costs more accu-

 Raise Rural Health Clinic reimbursements to more appropriately cover costs

 Extend several expiring Medicare adjustment payments for rural practitioners, including physicians practicing in physician scarcity areas, rural ambulance providers rural home health agencies and specific classes of rural hospitals

• Provide greater flexibility for unique factors create disparities in Critical Access Hospital lab ser-

> • Boost payments to Rural Health Clinics


